Present: Mayor David M. Nussbaumer and Trustees David McGuire, Lloyd A. Green, Robert Brown, Frederick Alderman.

Vouchers: Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, to approve payment of the vouchers in the amount of \$10,148.06.

Minutes: Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Brown and carried, to accept the minutes of the previous two board meetings, January 15, 1973 and January 29, 1973.

Wayne Co. Mayor Assoc.: Mayor Nussbaumer reminded the board that the Wayne County Mayor's Association would be meeting in Lyons on February 19, 1973 at 7:00 P.M. in their Village Hall. He urged board members to attend.

Mayor's Committee: Mayor Nussbaumer advised that he would like the approval of the board for the appointment of gentlemen to represent the Village of Palmyra along with members of the Town of Palmyra, to be so appointed by the Town Board, who would act as liaison between the Village and Town to form a firmer understanding and promote better cooperation between the two.
Motion by Trustee Brown, 2nd by Trustee Green that the following be so appointed: Edward Dickinson, Birdsall Parkway; George Contant, Cuyler Street; and Frederick Alderman, Canandaigua Street. On voice vote Trustee Brown voted aye, Trustee Green, aye; Trustee McGuire, aye. Trustee Alderman abstained from voting.

Police Report: On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, the Police Report for the month of January, 1973 was approved. Highlights of the report revealed that there were 169 complaints with 17 accidents investigated, along with 4 each Burglary 3rd Degree, and Petit Larceny, with 14 Illegal Parking violations. Total fines and bail forfeitures collected for both Motor Vehicle and Criminal arrests amounted to \$267.00.

Raise D.Shul-ters: H. VanEtten, operator of the Water & Sewer Plants informed the board that David Shulters, who has been an employee of the Village for a year and one half, has now received his Water License as well as having been to Sewer School and receiving one of the highest marks in the both water and sewer classes. Motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee Brown that he be raised \$.15 (fifteen cents per hour) as of February 12, 1973. Vote by board: Trustee Alderman, aye; Trustee Brown, aye; Trustee McGuire, aye. Trustee Green opposed indicating that it exceeded the amount allotted in the budget. Board commented that this may be subject to adjustment as of 6/1/73.

Seminar for Sew. Plant Operators: H. VanEtten advised that there will be a special seminar in Albany on March 27, 1973 for Sewer Plant Operators in relation to Biological Testing. He felt that it would be advantageous for him to be in attendance. Motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, to send H. VanEtten with expense of such seminar borne by the Village.

Present ordinance does not allow him to do this. WHEREAS, the existing provisions of town law are outdated in view of the modern services provided by towns and villages, and **WHEREAS**, many provisions of the town law provide services that are general town charges which were enacted before town services became so intense and before villages provided a great many services, and,

WHEREAS, the general population growth in towns and villages in the past seventy years has resulted in tremendous increases in the cost of operating town and village governments, and,

WHEREAS, town law does not provide a means of levying taxes on real property receiving extra benefits, but must levy taxes on the entire area of the town, including the area within villages.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra hereby recommends that the proper legislation be enacted to relieve property owners within the Village of Palmyra from taxes levied by the Town of Palmyra for services provided by the Town exclusively in the unincorporated area.

Section 2. Be it further resolved that the state legislature revise the laws to provide for the equitable allocation of town costs for town services to be certain that those who receive such services pay for the same, while those who do not receive such services are relieved from the cost thereof.

Section 3. Be it further resolved that copies of the resolution be sent to Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller, Senator Fred Warder and Assemblyman James Hurley, Senator Warren Anderson, Senator Joseph Zaretzki, Minority Leader of the Senate, Speaker of the Assembly Perry B. Duryea, Majority Leader of the Assembly John E. Kingston, and Minority Leader of the Assembly Stanley Steingut.
