Vil. of Manchester Wat. Cont .:

Representatives of the Village of Manchester, Mayor Liberty, Trustee Philip D'Arduini, and Village Attorney Morris Tyo, conferred with the board relative to the Village of Manchester Water Contract with the Village of Palmyra. To date, it has not been necessary for them to turn the valves to obtain any water from the Village of Palmyra line which lays in the Town Village of Palmyra Board commented that, while of Manchester. the Village has not billed them, even though according to the contract this was permissable even though no water were used, the Village of Palmyra has had to pay pipe line taxes to the school district and Town of Manchester. Manchester representatives asked if it would be possible to obtain the assessment over the years on the pipe line. Clerk was asked to delve into this matter.

The boards agreed to discuss the matter at a future date after

the information had been obtained.

Narcotic Council: Rhett Butler, a member of a sub-committee of the Narcotic Council, informed the board that programs had been instituted in the schools. About 15 area schools are to be contacted after which speakers will appear in each school. He ascertained that it will cost the Village around \$300.00 for its share of a speaker. There will be 2 in this area for a cost of \$600.00 plus the advertising with another source picking up the other \$300.00. It is expected, he commented, that the Narcotic Council will set up rules for school activities.

Public Hearing Re: Dog Control:

In accordance with a Proof of Posting as read by Mayor Nussbaumer a Public Hearing was scheduled for 7:30 P.M. relative to an amendment to the Control of Dogs & Other
Animals Ordinance. Approximately 30 people either peered in or were in the Trustees Room. Mayor Nussbaumer explained that this would not be a leash law, but that the amendment did mean that during the daytime the dog must be under control of the owner to the extent that when called by name, the dog would immediately respond and come to the owner. Dogs running loose downtown would be picked up by the dog warden. Harold Fisher, the present dog warden for the Village of Palmyra, has indicated that an annual charge for this service to the village would be \$1,500.00, as opposed to a charge of \$10,000.00 for a full time warden, if we were to go to a strict leash law. Comments from citizens: Mrs. Mary Duffy, Cuyler Street, revealed that she felt the present ordinance as it is is good. Albert Lawrence responded that he feels that the village should adopt this new measure. At least it would help to prevent the spillage of garbage cans, debris in others yards, etc.

Mayor Nussbaumer reiterated that the prime reason for the new amendments is to allow the dog warden to pick up dogs in the daytime. Present ordinance does not allow him to do this. Mayor Nussbaumer advised that 2 years ago the state requested information relative to our local ordinance and any suggestions that might apply on the state level for better rules to even include a \$25.00 license fee. Harold Fisher volunteered the information that there are about 1106 dogs registered with 429 in the village.

Loziers Wayne Ackert, Lozier Engineers, Inc., conferred with the board Re: Wat. relative to the charges on the bills that had been rendered in the amount of \$1,000.00 and \$5,222.75.

Approval was given by the board for the payment of \$1,000.00

as this had been agreed on.
Trustee Alderman commented that the other bill for over \$5,000.00 appeared to be high due to the fact that the board was not cognizant of the amount of work and time involved in the research done by Loziers in order to detect the actual point of leaks and problems related to the leaks. Mr. Ackert

reiterated that due to the fact that he had become engrossed to the point of being intrigued with the problem, that he had overlooked informing the board of the excessive cost. Therefore, under the circumstances, he agreed to submit a bill for \$2,500.00. \$Re500.:

N.Y.S. Elec. & Gas Request:

Lozier Engineers, Inc., had advised by letter that before they could proceed with matters relating to new pumps and added filter capacity at the water plant, it would be necessary to run a temporary and a new permanent electrical service. York State Elec. & Gas., Loziers advised, would like an official letter from the village so stating that they would pay the costs involved.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Village of Palmyra to install new pumps and additional filter capacity at the water plant on Spring Street, and,

WHEREAS, the New York State Electric & Gas through Lozier

Estimate of Cost Desired:

Engineers, Inc., Rochester, N.Y., have requested a letter of certification from the Village of Palmyra,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Clerk write a letter to the New York

State Electric & Gas to verify the proposed installation with the request that an estimate of the cost be submitted to the Village of Palmyra for their records.

Add. to Filter Plant:

Wayne Ackart, Lozier Engineers, Rochester, N.Y. commented to the board that since last year when an estimate of \$30,000.00 was submitted for the possible additions to the filter plant, costs have "sky-rocketed" to the point that this figure may be nearly doubled.

Water Control -Albany:

Mr. Ackart commented that during the discussion with Edwin L. Vopelak, Chief of the Bureau of Water Regulation, in Albany, at which H. VanEtten, Attorney H.B. Nesbitt, Mayor D. Nussbaumer, and himself were present, it was assumed that the village would be able to obtain 2,000,000 gals. per day from Canandaigua Lake.

Raw Wat. Line Break:

Lake Shore Dr. & E. Lake

A water line break in the raw water line approximately in the intersection of Lake Shore Drive and East Lake Road, outside of the City of Canandaigua was noted. In checking the exact spot, it has been determined that the Village of Palmyra has an easement for the water line, but it would appear that a Tavern, presently owned by Clark M. Holcomb, has placed an addition about five (5) feet from the water line. Several years ago at the time of the addition, there was discussion of revising the easement, but apparently, this was not done. Ray Smith and H. VanEtten will make arrangements to repair the water break. It was mentioned that undoubtedly, shoring material as well as outside help will be needed to repair the leak as quickly as possible.

Dispose of Exist. Pumps & Motors:

W. Ackart commented that it would be his suggestion that the village keep the existing pumps and motors in the filter plant to be sold by the village rather than turning over to whoever receives the bid for the work to be done. Speed of the motors is 3450 RPM. The other alternative would be for salvage for later use. Board asked W. Ackart to draw specs on these motors for

bidding.

February 26, 1973

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Zoning Changes: Bruce Wideman, Zoning Officer, had drawn specifications for dedication of new streets, which would pertain to width, foundation and topping. He suggested that this might be done by Local Law. Clerk instructed to check with Attorney Nesbitt on proper procedure.

F. Ziegler Complaint:

Fred Ziegler, Canandaigua Street, had previously contacted Mayor Nussbaumer advising that he had paid his sidewalk bill but understood that there were some sidewalks in the village installed by village crews were put in "free" to the home owner. He advised that when the sewer was put in, over 12 years ago, that the sidewalk had been broken at that time. Board agreed that he should have noted the damage at that time and reported same to the village.

Minutes: Amendments:

On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire, the minutes of the previous meeting, 2/12/73, should be amended to read that Robert Giles is a Fire Commissioner and not an Asst. Fire Chief, and Rev. Berges, who was appointed to the Fire Department, will be a member and on vote of the Fire Department, he may or may not be chaplain, this being the perogative of the department to choose their own chaplain.

Accept Lane Pipe Bid: On motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee Brown and carried, the low bid of Lane Construction for 1,000 Feet of Storm Sewer Pipe in the amount of \$1,396.50 was approved.

Storm Sew. Ease .:

February 26, 1973
Negotiations have been in the process between G. Contant, owner of the building adjacent to the west of the Village Hall to place a storm sewer drain on this property to take care of the run-off from the roofs of the Village Hall. The present lessor, Paul F. Braun, objected to an easement in view of the fact that he might want to place a building on the site of the easement. Therefore, a license has been drawn stipulating that the Village of Palmyra may place a storm drain on their property between the Contant Building and the Village Hall to extend north and south.
On motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, the Mayor was authorized to sign the form in behalf of the village.

Fire Dept. Member: On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, on the recommendation of the Board of Fire Commissioners, the name of William R. Freyn, Trolley Road, Palmyra, N.Y., was approved as a trainee member of the Fire Department.

Resol. Request Tax Relief:

The following resolution was proposed by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried: Essence of resolution requested leaders in the State Government beginning with Gov. N. A. Rockefeller to exercise their influence to legislate some revisions of the laws to provide more equitable costs of town services and exempt villages from paying for services never received.

Resolution urging enactment of state laws to relieve property owners within the Village of Palmyra from taxes levied by the Town of Palmyra for services provided by the town exclusively

in the unincorporated area. WHEREAS, the existing provisions of town law are outdated in view of the modern services provided by towns and villages, and WHEREAS, many provisions of the town law provide services that are general town charges which were enacted before town services became so intense and before villages provided a

great many services, and, WHEREAS, the general population growth in towns and villages in the past seventy years has resulted in tremendous increases in the cost of operating town and village governments, and, WHEREAS, town law does not provide a means of levying taxes on real property receiving extra benefits, but must levy taxes on the entire area of the town, including the area

within villages.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra hereby recommends that the proper legislation be enacted to relieve property owners within the Village of Palmyra from taxes levied by the Town of Palmyra for services provided by the Town exclusively in the unincorporated area. Section 2. Be it further resolved that the state legislature revise the laws to provide for the equitable allocation of town costs for town services to be certain that those who receive such services pay for the same, while those who do not receive such services are relieved from the cost

thereof. Section 3. Be it further resolved that copies of the resolution be sent to Governor Nelson A.
