The Clerk-Treasurer advised that the oath of office had been administered to the elected Police Justice, William Abbott, for a term of four years beginning April 1, 1978 and ending March 31, 1982. Elected David West, Trustee for a term of two years beginning April 1, 1978 and ending March 31, 1980, to fill a vacancy created by a resignation. Elected Mary Lou Wilson, Trustee for a term of four years beginning April 1, 1978 and ending March 31, 1982. Elected David Williamson, Trustee, for a term of four years beginning April 1, 1978 and ending March 31, 1982.

Mayor M. Katherine Davin announced that appointments would be made by her subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees for the ensuing year.

Mayor Davin advised that these boards are comprised of volunteer citizens who serve on the respective boards without compensation except the Urban Renewal Agency, whose funds for operation are allocated under State & Federal Grants, all of which is subject to audit by the New York State Department of Audit & Control.

Mayor Davin advised that due to lack of sufficient need for an engineer on a retaining fee, that if and when needed, an engineer may be employed on a fee basis.

**SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS:**  
Mayor Davin advised that two school crossing guards shall be included in the budget appropriation for the safety of children crossing street traffic during school days.

**PUBLIC WORKS FOREMAN:**  
Mayor Davin announced the appointment of Raymond Smith as PUBLIC WORKS FOREMAN for a period of one year beginning April 1, 1978 and ending March 31, 1979. In addition to the direct salary paid to the Public Works Foreman, living quarters shall be provided at 149 East Main Street in the apartment on the second floor of the P.T. Sexton Bldg., known as the Park & Club Bldg., which shall include utilities, such as water, sewer, heat and light, which shall be in the public interest to have residency on the premises to thwart any possible attempts of vandalism and destruction to the building and village park. In lieu of salary compensation, living quarters shall be figured at an equivalent of \$25.00 per week, to be classified as "Officers Maintenance", on which the Public Works Foreman will contribute from his weekly salary to Social Security based on \$25.00 and the Village of Palmyra as employer, shall contribute an equal share to Social Security.

**CEMETERY FOREMAN:**  
Mayor Davin announced the appointment of William Kaveny as CEMETERY FOREMAN.

**PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICER:**  
Mayor Davin announced the appointment of Dr. Morton Adams as Public Health Officer, having been appointed for a four year term beginning June 1, 1975 to terminate on May 31, 1979, with compensation to be determined on a fee basis by population as set by the State of New York.

**VITAL STATISTICS:**  
Mrs. Betty Stubbings, Town Clerk, in accordance with State Village Law may serve as Registrar of Vital Statistics for the Village of Palmyra and is to continue in this position.

**WATER OPERATOR HOUSING:**  
Mayor Davin announced the appointment of Harold Kruger as Water & Sewer Plant Operator in charge. Mayor Davin advised that living quarters shall be provided for the Water Operator at the Spring Street Water Plant, including utilities, such as water, sewer, heat, light and telephone, which shall be in the public interest to be available and on call in case of emergency, at no charge to the operator except for personal long distance phone calls, which personal calls shall be reimbursed to the village. Such living quarters shall be figured at an equivalent of \$40.00 per week, to be classified as "Officers Maintenance" on which the Water Operator will contribute from his weekly salary to Social Security based on the \$40.00 and the Village of Palmyra shall contribute an equal share to Social Security.

**WATER BILLER COLLECTOR:**

the board by reading a letter he had written, that he wished to

County. He continued that he would be glad to assist in training  
anyone who is appointed by the board to help in acclimating the  
person relative to the Housing and Zoning Code, attend zoning  
hearings and assist in any way possible. In the capacity of  
Building Inspector, he would continue at \$1.00 per year (one dollar)  
Acting Mayor Wilson thanked him for the last eleven years of help  
to the village as Zoning, Housing, and Building Inspector.

Trustee Williamson commented that he felt that in view of the fact that VanParys has been the carrier for a number of years and is a taxpayer within the village, it would be his feeling that the bid should be awarded to them.

Library: Mrs. Cass Vande spoke to the Village Board relative to the needs of the Library Association, pointing out that costs have doubled. The library is privately endowed with some \$100,000.00, she advised, but it has been necessary to "dip" into some of these funds to do some renovation of the library building. She indicated that they do have considerable volunteer help, which helps to keep some of the costs of operation down. Acting Mayor Wilson advised that the board is cognizant of the remodelling of the building and of the needs. Trustee Green commented that several citizens had commented to him that the Village should consider giving some of its Revenue Sharing Funds to the Library. Trustee Green advised that the Village will soon have a public hearing, when the Village is informed of the amount of Revenue Sharing that will be forthcoming for the next year. At that time, he added, it would be apropos for members of the library association to represent themselves & ask or suggest use of some of the Revenue Sharing funds for the library.

Conifer: Acting Mayor Wilson advised that Conifer Development Associates, Rochester, New York, contractors for the Senior Citizen Housing on Canal Street, have advised that they will be receiving additional funds from the government. In view of this, they would like to consider erecting other senior housing on the north section of Canal Street, opposite the present development.

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Police Report:

On motion by Trustee Williamson, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, the Police Report for the month of March, 1978 was accepted. Highlights of the report indicated 133 complaints investigated together with 16 accidents and 15 assists to other departments. Five (5) were apprehended for Petit Larceny and 45 were cited for illegal parking. Total fines and bail forfeitures amounted to \$305.00.

Police Chief Henry commented on an incident on March 25, 1978, relating that Officers Trowbridge and Young noted a dent in the police car caused by someone kicking the car. Footprints in the snow led to the apartment of the wrongdoer, who was charged and brought in front of Judge Abbott.

Clerk Otte advised that in conferring with former Water & Sewer Plant Operator, Hiram VanEtten, who reviewed the records of the King's Court with 33 units, The Valley Forge Manor with 50 units, the Valley Forge Town House Apartments with 52 units, Swiss Chalet #1 with 8 and Chalet #2 with 8, Chalet #3 with 8, Chalet #4 with 8, Park Hill Buildings #2, #3, #4, #5, all with 8 units, it was learned that each apartment is charged with one full unit or \$21.00, based on the average water consumption of between 500 and 4,000 cu. ft. per quarter.

Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Williamson and carried, to so inform Conifer Development that in view of the experience of other apartments, it is apropos to charge them on the same basis.

Budget:

Mayor Davin asked the Clerk-Treasurer to explain the budget in detail to the citizens present.  
General comments relative to the budget concerned comparison of amount of gasoline used by the Police Department as compared to that used by the Highway Department. Treasurer Otte advised that in the Street Maintenance Account - A5110.40 - relating to gas, oil, grease, allocations of gasoline used by the highway trucks is also reflected in the Snow Removal Account, Street Cleaning Account, and Off Street Parking. Mr. Contant questioned the increase in salary for Village Attorney Poyzer.  
Treasurer Otte informed the group that part of her salary also pertains to her work for the Zoning Board of Appeals. Legal Findings & Decisions for this board drawn in legal terminology is now a requisite.  
Mr. Contant commented that no expenditures showed at this time for state retirement.  
Treasurer Otte advised that the official bill will arrive the end of May, 1978, in the amount of some \$23,000.00, part of which will be allocated to the water & sewer department, along with a separate bill for the Police Department in the amount of some \$8,500.00.  
Mrs. Shelia Maxwell, spoke in behalf of the Library noting that the Village has appropriated \$4,000.00 to the Library. She indicated that after seeing the village budget, it was understandable that the village board has done well.  
Mr. Contant thanked the clerk treasurer for the explanation of the items.
