In any of the provisions in the foregoing Ordinance are decided by any court having jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the foreging Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid. Section 5. VIOLATIONS AND

PENALTIES.

Violation of this Ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

Any persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable for first offense by a fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or by impriosnment for not less than two (2) nor more than fifteen (15) days. The third or subsequent offense within one (1) year shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months or both such fine and imprisonment.
