

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF
AN ORDINANCE

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the following Ordinance was adopted by the Village Board of the Village of Palmyra, New York, at a regular meeting held on the 19th day of July, 1971:

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING
CERTAIN TYPES OF VEHICLES
FROM PROSPECT HILL PARK

Section 1. DEFINITIONS.

The words and terms used in this Ordinance unless otherwise expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires, shall have the same meaning as defined in the Vehicle and Traffic Law and Conservation Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. PROHIBITING CERTAIN TYPES OF VEHICLES FROM PROSPECT HILL PARK.

No person shall operate, stand, or park any motorcycle, mini-bike, snowmobile, at any time upon any portion of the Village property commonly known as Prospect Hill Park.

Section 3. REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES.

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Village of Palmyra inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this Ordinance shall be in addition to the other ordinances regulating and govern

ing the subject matter covered by this Ordinance.

Section 4. VALIDITY.

In any of the provisions in the foregoing Ordinance are decided by any court having jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the foregoing Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 5. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

Violation of this Ordinance shall constitute disorderly conduct, and the person violating the same shall be a disorderly person.

Any persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punishable for first offense by a fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or by imprisonment for not less than two (2) nor more than fifteen (15) days. The third or subsequent offense within one (1) year shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after due publication and posting in accordance with the provisions of the Village Law of the State of New York.

PARKING IN VILLAGE
PARKING LOTS

Section 1. DEFINITIONS.

The words and terms used in this Ordinance unless otherwise expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires, shall have the same meaning as defined in the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. APPLICATION OF
ORDINANCE.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply except when it is necessary to stop a vehicle to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device.

Section 3. PARKING LIMITED
IN VILLAGE PARKING LOTS.

a. The parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited between 9:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. for a period of longer than two (2) hours in the Village parking lot on the east side of Cuyler Street from the east side of Cuyler Street to a depth of 164 feet easterly.

- Present:** Mayor David Nussbaumer, Trustees Lloyd Green, Frederick Alderman, Donald Leysath. Absent, Donald Sinclair.
- Vouchers:** Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried to approve payment of vouchers.
- Fire Contract:** Village Attorney Nesbitt discussed a letter received from the Town of Palmyra re: their desire to continue at \$6,000.00.
Motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee Green to allow Mayor Nussbaumer to sign letter advising that the Village does not wish to renegotiate for one year at the same rate.
- Sew. Updating:** Bids to be advertised 7/29 with bid opening 9/2/71.
- Dist. Sew.:** Clerk informed the board that Aug. 4 at 8:30 P.M. a joint meeting with the Town of Palmyra will be held to discuss the District Sewers.
- Prospect Hill Ordin.:** Mini-Bikes. Trustee Leysath questioned enforcement of law but would O.K.
Motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried to accept ordinance "Prohibiting Certain Types of Vehicles from Prospect Hill Park." (Ord. attached Page 64)
- Dump:** The board discussed the possibility of contracting care of the dump out to a firm. Village Attorney Nesbitt commented that there is a feeling this should be a town operation, if not a private individual.
- Ord. in Vil. Park Lots :** Parking in the proposed ordinance in the Village Parking Lots are for the hours of 9:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. on Cuyler, etc.
Motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried to accept the ordinance "Limiting Parking in Village Parking Lots." (Ord. attached Page 64)
- Investments:** Trustee Alderman asked Village Attorney Nesbitt if there might be any problems if the village changed investments counsellors from Marine Midland to Security Trust.
- Zon. Appeals:** Village Attorney Nesbitt commented on hearing of Laurentian Dr. Zoning Board and Peterson meeting on July 20th at 7:00 P.M.
- Plan. Brd.:** Motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Green that Robert Joyce be appointed to a 5 year term on the Planning Board. Motion carried. Clerk instructed to advise him by letter. Letter written 7/22/71.
- Drugs:** The Narcotics Council and the board had a general discussion of Palmyra being "loaded" with easy access of drugs. Consequently, there are foreigners infiltrating.
- Trowbridge Probation:** Police Chief Donald Henry requested the Village Board to place Fred Trowbridge on a probationary period for six months effective July 19th. Since the full board was not present the appointment was tabled until 8/2/71.
- Tn. of Manchester:** The Town of Manchester advised the Village of Palmyra that a tentative Fire Contract figure as of Dec. 1971 may be \$438.00.
Motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried to accept the above fire contract. Clerk instructed to notify by letter of the acceptance.
- Fire Parade:** An invitation to Village Board members to be in the Firemen's Parade on Aug. 28th at 6:00 P.M. at the Village Hall. (Advise on Aug. 16th).
- Chg. Ord.:** Change order #3, job number 7118 was submitted to the board for the addition of door and hardware to rear corridor @ janitor's room in the amount of \$73.01. Change order approved.
