AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING A ONE-WAY ROADWAY

Section 1. DEFINITIONS

The words and phrases used in this ordinance, unless otherwise expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires, shall have the same meaning as defined in the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

Section 2. ONE-WAY ROADWAY

Fayette Street, from the south bounds of Walker Street to the north bounds of East Foster Street, is hereby designated for one-way traffic in a northerly direction.

Section 3. REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCE

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Village of Palmyra inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this Ordinance shall be in addition to the other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this Ordinance.

Section 4. VALIDITY

If any of the provisions in the foregoing Ordinance be decided by any court having jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the foregoing Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.

DEFINITIONS

Section 1.

The words and phrases used in this ordinance,

unless otherwise expressly stated, or unless the context or

subject matter otherwise requires, shall have the same mean-

ing as defined in the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

ONE-WAY ROADWAY

Section 2.

Tyette Street, from the south bounds of Walker

Street to the north bounds of East Foster Street, is hereby

designated for one-way traffic in a northerly direction.

REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCE

Section 3.

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances of

the Village of Palmyra inconsistent with the provisions of

this Ordinance are hereby repealed, provided, however, that

such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency

and in all other respects this Ordinance shall be in addition

to the other ordinances regulating and governing the subject

matter covered by this Ordinance.

VALIDITY

Section 4.

If any of the provisions in the foregoing

Ordinance be decided by any court having jurisdiction to be

unconstitutional or invalid, the same shall not affect the

validity of the foregoing Ordinance as a whole, or any part



Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

(a) This Ordinance shall take effect from and after the *29th* day of *June*, 1972, except those parts, if any, which are subject to approval under Section 1684 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law and Section 46 of the Highway Law of the State of New York.

(b) Any part or parts of this Ordinance which are subject to approval under Section 1604 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law and Section 46 of this Highway Law of the State of New York shall take effect from and after the day on which approval in writing is received from the New York State Department of Transportation.
