The report of cemetery collections in amount of #393.25 was ordered received and filed.

The Clerk was authorized to sign a contract with the John Wiley Jones Company, who furnished Chlorine for treatment of Village water.

Mr. Larsen of the firm of Smith and Fitzpatrick visited the Board and discussed plans for making a test on one of the filters in our water filter plant to determine the full amount of water that could be filtered through one filter in a given time by attaching a suction pump in the line to help draw the water through the filter. This suggestion was approved by the Board and it was agreed that arrangements should be made as soon as possible to prepare filter for this test.

Mr. Lord of the Potts Equipment Company of Watertown, N. Y. visited the Board to show various pictures of Street Flushers and tank trucks manufactured by this Company which he felt would be adequetefor this Village. The complete cost of this equipment would be about \$22,000.00 and as the Village is not in a position to spend that amount of money at this time, the matter was tabled until further investigation could be made.

The Clerk was directed to write to Mrs. Mildred F. Taylor and thank her for her loyal support in introducing several bills changing our Village Charter and getting favorable action on same.

The Clerk was directed to contact the New York Electric and Gas Association and request that a light be placed on pole number 3 on Kent Street in front of the Town Barn and also request that a shade be placed on the light in front of 138 West Charlotte Avenue.

A letter received from Miss Mary Griffin together with a bill for cleaning her furnace which she stateswas due to storm sewer backing up and flooding her cellar, was ordered filed.

Mr. Brown was authorized to employ Abram Cleason Company shovel and operator to level off lot owned by Village and situated on West side of Vienna Street entrance of Cemetery.

Wallace J. Beatty was authorized to write \$7500.00 Fire and extended coverage on Park and Club Building for a three year period.

Please drive carefully and obey the traffic rules", or similar wording that might be agreed upon by both parties.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Jeffery, seconded by Mr. Johnson, same were approved.
