**CALL TO ORDER:** Mayor Wilson called the meeting to order at 7: 31 p.m.

OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER:

<u>The Courier Journal</u> shall be approved as the official newspaper for the Village, to publish and bring such legal notices, statements, notices for bids and other legal notices for the ensuing year to the attention of the citizens for the

Village of Palmyra.

EMPLOYEE BONDS:

Mayor Wilson moved that bonds be provided by VanParys Associates for

the following bond amount for employees set by the Board: To cover the Village Clerk, Treasurer, and Deputy Clerk.

Blanket bond in the amount of \$150,000.

BOARD MEETINGS: The regular meetings of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra shall be held at 7:30 p.m. on the First and Third Monday, in the months beginning 4/1/96 through 4/3/97, with the exception that any holidays which may fall on the above dates will automatically move the regular meeting night to the next day evening. The Village Clerk will prepare a written agenda for each Village Board meeting following the same guidelines as resolved in previous years.

## **REGULAR MEETING**

MINUTES OF MARCH 18, AND MARCH 27, 1996 Mayor Wilson moved to approve the minutes of the regular Village Board meeting on March 18th and the special meeting on March 27th as written. Seconded by Trustee Celentano. Vote, 5 ayes. CARRIED.

<u>COMMITTEE REPORTS:</u> Mayor Wilson motioned to postpone committee reports until the new trustees have had a better chance to become acquainted with their assignments. Seconded by Trustee Guest. Vote, 5 ayes. **CARRIED.** 

**BUDGET MEETING:** Mayor Wilson moved to schedule a board meeting for April 4, 1996 for the purpose of working on the budget. Seconded by Trustee Gunkler. Vote, 5 ayes. **CARRIED.** 

GRANDIN BUILDING PROJECT: Mark Vande gave a presentation about the proposed construction project on the Grandin Building. He introduced David Poulson, the representative from Salt Lake City and Ken Graham, the "clerk of the works". The front of the building will be completely enclosed for the construction leaving approximately a four foot wide walkway for pedestrian traffic. The area behind the building will be used by a crane for approximately six months. The hairdresser's shop, known as Christine's, will be torn down and become part of the proposed structure. Any structure or service that will need to be removed will be replaced to better-than-present condition; ie. the blacktop in the back parking lot which will be removed to bring the underground electrical service. They would like to use the lower parking lot (area behind the Laundromat) for construction vehicles and storage.

Mr. Vande needed to know any major concerns of the Board before his meeting with the contractors on Monday April 8th. Trustee Salomon asked if the businesses would have any interruption of business. Mr. Vande says this should be minimal but possibly when electric needs to be shut off. Chief Dalton wondered if the driveway that goes behind the Laundromat would be affected but Mr. Vande said that wouldn't be necessary. May 1, 1996 is the scheduled start date. Mayor Wilson thanked Mr. Vande for his presentation.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Irwin Porter had some questions concerning the completion of the drainage project on Gates Street. Dan Wooden told him SKANEX will be trying to finish it up as soon as weather permits. He also expressed his concern for the lack of communication from the previous board on this matter. The rebuilding of the sidewalks and lawns will be done by village crews.

Dick Peck asked about the status of the dirt that was put down last summer at their property on Gates. It isn't draining. The work will be done as soon as weather permits.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** Letter from Tom Hunt also regarding the clean up process of the Gates Street drainage project. This matter was referred to Fred Celentano.

Letter received from Todd Goddard regarding the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. Trustee Guest moved that the Village Board accommodate the Stations of The Cross walk. Seconded by Trustee Gunkler. Vote, 5 ayes. CARRIED.

Complaint filed by Mr. John Berry with the Palmyra Fire Department. He alleged that he tripped on sidewalk that was sticking up. Matter referred to insurance company.

Letter received from Jeffery Fuels requesting their property at Hyde Parkway and West Main St. be rezoned Highway Commercial (C-3). This matter was referred to Trustee Gunkler.

Final letter of consent has been received from Mrs. Barclay so the work can be started on the Cuyler Street project. Nelson Cook will oversee this project as approved by the previous board. This scheduled start date is April 15th.

ADJOURNMENT: Trustee Celentano moved to adjourn at 8:45 pm. Seconded by Trustee Gunkler. Vote, 5 ayes. CARRIED.
