

Donald Wallace, Spokesman for the merchants, commented on the Downtown Parking Beautification Project. He indicated that Tn. Imprv.: it has been determined a common language of a lease for 40 years would be agreeable. Included in the lease would be certain protections forthe landowners, their needs and rights. The lease was patterned after one drafted in Lyons which includes not only the tenants but the property owners.

Strong:

Commented that he was under the impression that some merchants are reluctant to sign. What about condemnation?

Wallace:

Advised that one merchant wants special wording. There will be four parcels to be obtained by acquisition.

Strong:

Must have the cooperation of all merchants.

C.Collie: Would rather improve my own property but would be happy to have the village fix up the parking lot behind store. Commented that the bulk of the money is being spent on the north side and not the south side, where he is located.

Strong:

Advised that it is imperative that everyone agree to sign leases and then discussions can be had relative to finances.

P. Cherry:

Interjected that neither the Chamber of Commerce nor the Merchants Association are involved. It is only the individual merchant.

Wallace: Commented that to the best of his knowledge, all had agreed to sign a lease.

STRONG: As an example, Strong mentioned that of approximately \$120,000. the village taxpayers would be obliged to pay 50% with the merchants paying the other one-half.

General discussion regarding funding.

Green:

Which merchants would be involved? Are you suggesting all merchants in the village? (Meaning those such as Breen's at the east end of the village, or just the ones adjacent and bounded by the project?)

Wallace:

Outlined with a pen on the map the area by a circle relating to the project.

D. Wilson:

Douglas Wilson, employee of the McPike Co., corner of Market & East Main, northeast corner, commented that this an opportunity to get a tremendous amount done with a nominal cost to the merchants. There is no clear cut answer. The downtown is crucial to the village and village taxes should pay for all or on a 50/50 basis. The merchants must have parking.

Request re:Zon.: A letter received from H. B. Nesbitt, Esq., in behalf of his client, Sherwood Mate, owner of property at 122 Cuyler Street, former funeral home, suggested that this area be re-zoned to C-1 rather than R-2, in view of the fact that it borders on C-1 with the Post Office directly south together with the American Legion Home and across the street directly west, the L.O.O.M. Lodge. Board asked clerk to write to Planning Board to render an opinion.

Ont.Pipe re: Lape Sewer:

Clerk advised that a letter had been written to Woodward, Assoc. suggesting they in turn write to Ontario Pipeline informing them of the bill paid by the village to Ronald Smith in the amount of \$928.50 for the installation of the Lape sewer on East Foster Street due to the improper placing of the lateral some four (4) feet from the actual spot.

Ontario Pipeline replied to Woodward that "It is our contention that this matter has not been proven or truly demonstrated to be our responsibility.
