COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION PLAN GROUP PRESENTATION SCRIPT. BY MAYOR ELLIOTT AND MRS. KATHY WOODEN: Mayor Elliott briefly discussed the Antidrug and Antialcohol committee which the Pal-Mac School is forming or has formed. Mayor Elliott noted that he needed a PD volunteer and requested that one be appointed by Chief Dalton. Mayor Elliott requested a volunteer from the VB and Trustee Wooden moved to appoint Trustee Drews to this position, seconded by Trustee Guest, vote, 3 ayes, CARRIED.

Chief Dalton would let Mayor Elliott know tomorrow 4-4-95 who his appointee would be after finding out more information about this program.

Mayor Elliott noted he would get a copy of this presentation for those that would like one.

NYCOM DRUG TESTING PROGRAM: Mayor Elliott reported that this program would be held at the Pal-Mac High School in May 24, 1995, at 3:00 p.m. Information will be coming out from NYCOM shortly.

<u>CROP WALK:</u> Mayor Elliott moved to authorize the Crop Walk to be held on May 7th, 1995 and use the Park and Club Room and Village Main Street Park from about 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Motion seconded by Trustee Guest, vote, 3 ayes, <u>CARRIED</u>.

4-H MONEY COLLECTION: Mayor Elliott noted that the State DOT should be asked permission since Rt. 21 N and Rt. 31 are State highways and the 4-H would like to collect money at that intersection on the east end of the Village. A letter is to be written to Donna Merritt informing her of this requirement. Trustee Guest also requested that an inquiry be made about the time and 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. noting that 8 hours was much too long to tie up the intersection.

SURPLUS FOR AUCTION: A motion was made by Mayor Elliott to declare a plow blade, two (2) answering machines, about 20 bikes from the PD garage of various types, seconded by Trustee Wooden vote, 3 ayes, CARRIED.

LANDMARK MEETING: Trustee Guest and Mayor Elliott reported on the meeting at the Landmark Society and that it was very informative. E Hartnagel noted the meeting was very informative.

<u>CANAL CORRIDOR:</u> Trustee Wooden noted that there was a 4'  $\times$  8' sign to make the project official. The sign was at the highway dept and needs to be placed near the project at the canal. The sign is from the State.

FOSTER ST. WATER MAIN: MRB told Trustee Wooden that MRB was not aware that Villager was not working on the water main project. Trustee Wooden noted that one house was going to close and that the water line needed to be done. Trustee Wooden meet with Villager two (2) weeks ago, he reported that Villager did think they would not have to continue the work until August. Trustee Wooden noted that MRB was planning to get back him tomorrow with additional updates.

<u>SEAR BROWN:</u> Mayor Elliott noted that Sear Brown is the engineer for the Canal Corridor Project and that he had spoken to Sear Brown.

MEPATITIS B: Mayor Elliott reported that the Hep. B vaccines were noted to be unsuccessful in enough tests so that booster shots are warranted. Clerk Hays reported the prices for vaccine were approx. \$27 per shot and blood tests were \$15 per test. For each person about \$57 was needed for boosters and tests. Approx. 40 persons need to have these shots and tests about \$3,500 worth. A motion was made by Mayor Elliott to purchase the necessary serum and arrange for the testing seconded by Trustee Wooden, vote, 3 ayes, CARRIED.

EXEC. SESSION: Mayor Elliott moved to go into exec. sess. at 8:50 p.m. seconded by Trustee Guest for matters of union negotiation and personnel, vote, <u>3 ayes, carried.</u>
