Moment of Silence: Budget Hearing:

Mayor Strong called for a moment of silence prior to conducting the Budget Hearing.

At 7;09 p.m., Mayor Strong called the meeting to order and req. that the Clk. read the "Legal Notice" advertising the Budget Hearing for the Village of Palmyra, 1985-86, for 7:00 p.m., 4 15/85. Mayor Strong reviewed - tax levy, \$506.184.; tax base \$42.090.240.; last yr.'s tax rate \$10.99/this yr. s [proposed]; Gen. Fnd. approp., \$951.946.; Fed. Rev. Shrng. \$28.010.; Water Fnd. - 203.169.; Swr. Fnd., \$263.984.; Sp. Assess. - \$8.680. - Total of all fnds. -\$1,455,789. The Mayor pointed out that Fed. Rev. Shrng. will not be available and asked for questions frm. citizens. Discussion on going over budget line items - Mrs. L. Lynch said that people work/can't come in when office open to inspect budget. Several citizens appeared to be 'disgruntled' because copies were not available; Village Law section quoted, MAS. Lynch asked if Village in 'dire straights' because of past money problems/other Bds. had not used funds properly? The Mayor said that a "Fund Balance" is non-existent and when asked why he said that expenditures of Vill. Hall renovation & Vienna St. Reconstruction Proj. were cause. Mr. J. Rigney asked the Mayor if he had prepared a "budget statement/budget message."

Former Mayor M.L. Wilson asked to speak about allegations appearing in newspaper re financial plight of the Village/said . she took exception. She spoke of yrs. on Vill. B. /bringing Donegan Assoc. in to assist with Vill. finances; she felt then a valuable resour. - didn't feel they would let this happen While a member of Vill. Bd., she said that taxes to Vill. were not raised in six yrs./lowered twice; good investments made during that time - CD's - 16%/set money aside for future fire equip./water fnd. Did not need money - Cty. Bd. of Supervisors raised assessments; unemployment was on the rise; sales tax quadrupled. St. Aid per capita; set up reserve acci \$20,000. remaining when she went out of office/not a lot but more than when she went in office. She spoke of 100 units of sr. cit. housing which did not cost Vill.; Firehse. cost Vill. \$13,000.; \$65,0004 - UR seed money - went to Community Ctr. as did Fed. Rev. Shrng. - gym was combined efforts of everyone; Vill. did assist with \$40,000. to complete bldg. The former Mayor spoke of rehab. program downtown, i.e. sidewalks, parking, trees, etc. in which merchants shared cost. She spoke of costs of Vill. Hall renov. & Vienna St. - cost to hav jobs done right; low bid for Vienna St. - \$403,000./bonding she summed up by saying that she was proud of 'that' administration/inherited problems, too/rolled up sleeves and did something about it. She said during her adminis., never had third police car.

Mr. J. Rigney asked about \$20,000., justifying 13% increase; Trusiee Rolland felt would close out at 13% - Pol. Chf.'s recommendation to have 24-hr. police coverage - 5 F-T/2 P-T; Village seemed to want 24-hr. coverage - cut in P.D. will save lot of money; decrease in sales tax last year; decrease in

investments; last couple of years haven't been the best. Mrs. E. Hartnagel asked about 'free' copies of budget. Atty. J. Nesbitt said that she had borrowed his cpy. last year; Mr. J. Rigney, speaking to Mayor, said that he was empowered to provide copies if he so desired. Pg. 6 - Gen. Fnd. Tax Rate Analysis was referred to by Mr. J. Rigney - 'Gen. Govern. Support' or 'Transportation' what is 'transportation? Pg. 11 and middle of Pg. 12 in Budget Bk. - street maintenance, snow removal, st. lighting, sidewalks, off-st. pkng. - amt. of \$59,280. - covers equip. & cap. outlay - Mr. Rigney wanted explanation. It was explained that some of these monies tied in by Donegan to cover Vienna St. Proj. - \$60,000. adjustment if one takes out Vienna St. Mr. Rigney asked did not bonding cover Vienna St. and was told by Mr. Rolland that already purchased/cannot chng. debt limit. \$285,000. for bonding - out of Gen. Fnd. - cost over-run. Mr. Rigney there is a package put together to show what Vienna St. did cost taxpayers? The Mayor said that it is being worked upon at this time; problem with engineer/challenging dollar amt. - may have legal hassle. Contractor pd. off, accord. to Mayor. Treas. will put pkg. together. Mr. Rigney asked where reflected in budget to pay off Vienna St./Pg. 8 Gen. Exp.; chang. \$34-35,000.; Chngs. 184-85 estimates \$132,000., reason being for the jump, Vill. Hall renov. / Vienna St.

Mr. Rigney asked about Pg. 6 - Cultural & Recreation; Res. for fire equip; Cap. Res. for sts. - "Interfund Transfers" - and was told collected frm. taxes for streets/reg. operating budge . for streets/day-to-day operation. Mr. Rigney asked about contingency; Mr. Rolland said that \$4,000. going to HR6 - Cap. Res. for St. Rehab. & Rpr - \$135,300. in that Cap. Res. Fnd. for streets. Re Cap. Res. for Fire Equip. and additional money for new truck, the Mayor said bal. exists of \$78,540.; \$5,911. int. earn. & \$18,939. Fire Cont. Mr. Rigney asked what Bd.'s plans for streets; inf. that Foster/Stafford Sts. need repair. Mr. Rigney inquired further about Cap. Res. for Fire Equip.; inf. that money frm. Town Cont. put in reserve for equip. at end of yr., then transferred. Mr. Rigney said fire equip. fairly new; inf. by Trustee Elliott that it is projected new truck needed in 1990. Short disc. about placing Town money in operating budget. Mayor made ref. to Pg. 55 in Budget Bk. "Equip. List. and Replace. Plann. Guide." Mrs. Lynch, ref. to Bdg. Wkshop., asked about cutting F.D. \$10,000. The Mayor said cut from \$28,939. to \$18,939. Mr. Rigney ref. to Pg. 11/Gen. Fnd. - F.D. \$2414. and was told that amt. pd. to mechanic; only changed Cap. Res. Fnd. Mr. Rigney wanted to know where the \$10,000. went and was told in the Gen. Fnd/ covers all depts. Mr. Rolland pointed out that Vill. "didn't take"/"just never went there." Re Sewer Bond, Treas. said until 1990.

Mrs. M. DeNeef wanted to know what Police Dept. would cost and was told by the Mayor "less than \$200,000./\$190,000." Disc. on no. of policemen and salaries; Mrs. Lynch reiterated One Chf./One Dpty.Chf./two Patrolmen - hearing abolishing Pol. force on which Bd. voted; Bd. abolishing budget for them/is that not the same thing? Mayor said that Bd. would not be

Budget Hearing Cont'd: Kevin Schneider; Mrs. Lynch asked about Pol. Clk.'s position - will she be inf. - told by Mayor that she would be after budget adoption. Mrs. E. Hartnagel, re P.D. Budget, questioned figures - contained more benefits than wages - Mrs. M. DeNeef interjected that Vill. still doesn't have Highway Foreman; always have had one. Mr. R. Bender posed questions re portions of budgets which he did not understand/didn't follow; Bd. attempted to explain that in some areas, heretofore, proper codes were not always being charged for wk. being done; Bd. attempting to do this in new budget. Explanation re street lighting - \$5,000. increase projected for st. lighting - \$48,000. up to \$53,800. Inc. in ins. - Mr. Rigney wanted to know where same was reflected/inf. by Treas., Pg. 10 "unallocated ins."
