Mayor Davin advised that she had attended the Arbitration Hearing on December 22, 1977 relative to Robert Mingo. Weykman Bldg.: Mayor Davin informed the board that there is a sizable "dropoff" from the sidewalk level into anformer cellar area where
the former L. Weykman Bldg, 305 East Main Street, was standing
and leveled by the Wayne County Board of Supervisors. Mayor
Davin asked that a letter be sent to the Wayne County Board of

Protect: New York State Electric & Gas Corporation has requested permission to break the surface of the following streets for the purpose of applying cathodic protections to their gas facilities: E. Charlotte Ave. near Hathaway Place, Cuyler St., near Charlotte Ave., Cuyler St. near Jackson St., E. Jackson St., near Canandaigua St., Hyde Parkway and Church Street. On motion by Trustee Wilson, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, request was approved.

Park & Ride Sign:

Henry B. Nesbitt, Esq., purchaser of property at 122 Cuyler Street, adjacent to the renovated parking area, advised that the Park & Ride Sign is placed at the entrance of the parking lot between his property and the Bowling Alley. Those people who use the bus service obtain space in front of the lot adjacent to the sidewalk. It would be his suggestion that they be asked to park their cars in the rear to allow the short-term parker to have closer access to the sidewalk area.
