

**Present:** Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald and Trustees Lloyd Green, Mary Lou Wilson, Warner Strong and David McGuire.

**Vouchers:** Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Strong and carried, to approve payment of the vouchers in the amount of \$17,634.49.

**Minutes:** Motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to accept the minutes of the last board meeting.

**Zoning:** Bruce Wideman, Zoning Officer, advised that he had viewed the area behind the apartment building at 451 West Main Street, owned by Howard VanBortle, which has been filled with refuse, namely refrigerators, stoves, etc., and reported that apparently Mr. VanBortle is not going to cooperate to clean up this east end area.

Wideman commented that he had talked to the caretaker of the Palmyra Gardens at 355 West Main Street who advised that he did dump old refrigerators, etc. in the Towpath bed behind these apartments, but that village crews in the past have dumped huge limbs from cut-down trees in the canal bed in an attempt to fill in the recess. The caretaker, Mr. Bump, agreed that he would make an effort to clean up his refuse. Wideman further advised that L. Potter, owner of the laundromat on William Street, dumped the old washing machines in this area also.

Zoning Officer Wideman commented that in the past he has conferred with people relative to dumping of refuse, but in reality the Zoning Code and Housing Code have no instructions that this is the duty of the Zoning & Housing Officer. As a result, he really does not have the authority to ask people to clean up debris.

**Towpath:** B. Wideman revealed that he had talked to Robert Peterson, Chairman of the Wayne County Planning Board relative to the possibilities of cleaning up the Towpath. The discussion disclosed that there would be many problems involved, such as bonding and compensation for those who might want to volunteer their services. Chairman Peterson suggested that probably the better way would be for the village to hire college students and place them on the payroll of the village. Wideman agreed that he would be willing to work with Ray Smith, Highway Foreman, in this project.

**Suggest Hiring College Students** Trustee Strong questioned if Chairman Peterson would be willing to put this suggestion in writing to which Wideman replied that the Wayne County Planning Board has funds for such a project. Mayor Fitzgerald & Zoning Officer Wideman will make this a joint venture.

**Tree Removal:** Mayor Fitzgerald commented that a Mr. Breemes had asked permission to cut down trees along the bank of the Towpath. Such would be feasible if he would arrange with the village by an agreement for the removal, after which he could sell the wood if he so desired.

**Police Report:** Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Strong that the Police Report for the month of May, 1974, be accepted. Highlights of the report reveal that 201 complaints and 27 doors were found open and checked on by the department along with 7 cases of Petit Larceny and 14 arrests for speeding. Total fines and bail forfeitures for motor vehicle and criminal arrests amounted to \$277.00.

**Landfill:** Trustee Green advised that while all the fine details have not been completed, the Town of Palmyra will assume responsibility for the operation of the landfill including the purchase of it at a nominal fee of \$1.00, costs including legal fees, to be borne by the Village of Palmyra.

**\$1.00 Agreed Price** Trustee Green suggested that \$30,000.00 might be used for the construction of 3 tennis courts in the upper north section of the Village Park. He commented that it was his feeling that something should be done for the youth. After completion of the courts which would be lighted and fenced in, they would be turned over to the Community Center for operation. Trustee Strong queried what control would be imposed for the use of the courts. Trustee Green replied that they would be open to the public with a time limit for playing.



June 6, 1974

- Streets:** Trustee Green commented that he is expecting to pave Gates Street within the next week. Highway Foreman Ray Smith has raised the manholes in preparation of the paving. When this is completed, they will move onto East Foster, between Canandaigua Street and Fayette.
- Request Bids:** Motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee McGuire, that the clerk prepare the proper legal to request bids for the installation of 3 tennis courts, cost not to exceed \$30,000.00.
- Squad Car:** Trustee Wilson advised that she had the specs requested by the Fire Department for a squad car for the department. Motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee McGuire that clerk be asked to request bids for the piece of equipment, following a PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM.
- Urban Renewal:** Discussion of Urban Renewal relative to Meli Construction whose work in the Urban Renewal Area (Market, Canal & William Streets) was to have been started by now.
- Codification:** Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer advised that she had been in contact with General Code Publishers relative to a Local Law which would legalize the coding system of the code book as the official "Code of the Village of Palmyra."
- Urban Renewal:** Attorney Poyzer commented that she has written Village Planning Board Chairman, Dan Pope, relative to the proposed zoning of the Urban Renewal Area. Several questions in relation to funds that might or might not be available, as well as the in-kind services performed by the Village of Palmyra, were raised by the board members. In order to clarify, it was suggested that the clerk contact Agency Director Roche to request his attendance at future meetings. Trustee Strong suggested that a representative of HUD be present at the Urban Renewal meeting on June 11, 1974, to which all board members have been invited. Attorney Poyzer interjected that she would like a clarification as to whether the Village of Palmyra is classified as having received its grant under Section #15 or Section 15A in relation to Urban Renewal.
- Remove Park Spots?** Cora Sampson, 316 Clairmount Park, advised that she felt that the corner parking on Main Street in front of Johnson's Drug Store should be eliminated in view of the fact that cars traveling north on Cuyler to make a right hand turn frequently are detained because of a car backing out of the first parking spot. Board discussed the matter but felt that nothing could be changed at this time.
- Flags for Veterans:** Mrs. Ann Moss, as a representative of the American Legion, commented that the Legion and the V.F.W. would be glad to take care of the small flags that are, or have been in the past, placed on the graves of veterans by the cemetery crews. She commented that the flags should be removed 72 hours after any ceremony.
- Vil. to Purchase Legion & VFW-Place:** Motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, that the Village of Palmyra shall continue to purchase the flags but that the V.F.W. and Legion shall have the care of and responsibility of placing the flags on each veterans grave.
- Executive Session:** Motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, to convene in Executive Session at 8:40 P.M.

## Regular Board Meeting

## Board of Trustees

7:00 P.M.

**Present:** Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald, and Trustees David McGuire, Lloyd A. Green, Mary Lou Wilson, Warner Strong and Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer.

**2 Min. Silence:** Mayor Fitzgerald opened the meeting with the usual two minute period of silence.

**Vouchers:** On motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green, the vouchers in the amount of \$106,141.85 were approved for payment.

**Minutes:** Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Strong to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. Motion carried.

**Lake In-Take:** Hiram VanEtten, Operator of the Water Plant, advised that he had had a call from Mr. Weyman of Newark, who informed him that the Village of Newark recently had an inspection of the intake valve or cribbing in Canandaigua Lake. While repairing the Village of Newark's cribbing, he noted that the Village of Palmyra cribbing is in need of repair. The last inspection by Monroe Contractors Equipment, Rochester, New York, was done in April, 1969. VanEtten suggested that Monroe Contractors be contacted to make an inspection of the cribbing. Board agreed.

**Towpath:** Zoning Officer Bruce Wideman advised that he has talked to Robert Peterson, Wayne County Planning Chairman, relative to the Towpath which is in the vicinity of the Village of Palmyra. He hopes to have some concrete plans in the near future for clearing the area.

**Unfit Housing:** Zoning Officer Wideman commented that he is planning to close one multiple dwelling and a 2 family dwelling after notifying the owner in view of the fact that the housing is not up to standard and needs many repairs to make it acceptable to the Housing Code.

**Woodward Assoc.:** Olgert Sneider, Woodward Associates, Webster, N.Y., conferred with the board advising that after reviewing the bids submitted on June 5, 1974, for the installation of the extension of the sanitary sewer on Howell Street, and East Foster Street, it was the recommendation of Woodward Associates that the low bid of Ontario Pipeline, Inc., in the amount of \$110,000.00 be accepted.

**Resol.:** The following resolution was proposed by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Wilson as follows:

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Palmyra requested bids on 6/5/74 for the extension of a sanitary sewer line on Howell Street South and the corner of East Foster Street west from Howell Street to Johnson Street,

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT**, the low bid of Ontario Pipe Line, Rochester, New York in the amount of \$110,000.00 be accepted.

**Vil. Hall Roof Bid:** Proof of Publication requesting bids for the removal and repair of the east section of the Village Hall Roof and a section of south rear area along with resurfacing of the fire barn attached to the village hall on the south is so attached. Bids were to be opened at 7:30 P.M. There being no bids presented to the board, it was moved by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Strong and carried, that the village re-advertise for bids.



- Increase Grave Fees:** On the recommendation of Cemetery Caretaker, William Kaveny, Trustee McGuire advised that the grave opening should be increased from \$65.00 to \$75.00 and the cost of a grave to include perpetual care from \$85.00 to \$100.00. Motion was made by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, that until further notice the cost of grave openings shall be \$75.00 and the cost of a grave shall be \$100.00 to include perpetual care.
- Freezer Locker:** The former freezer locker on Market Street, now the property of the Village of Palmyra, as a gift by Mrs. Frances P. Rose, 8/5/71, has been viewed as being in decrepit condition and unsafe. Zoning Officer Wideman should review and write a letter to the board so stating the condition of the building.
- Hwy.Trk.:** Trustee Green advised that it would be his recommendation that the Village notify U.W. Sherburne, Inc. that in view of the recent correspondence from them relative to a possible delivery date of November, 1974 for a highway truck, that the board wait until this time before re-advertising for a truck. Board concurred that this should be done.
- Tennis Courts:** A letter from Shirley Black suggested that the Towpath be cleaned with some of the funds from Revenue Sharing. A letter from Sheldon Knapp outlined several ways of using the Revenue Sharing money instead of installing tennis courts in the upper north section of the Village Park.
- W.Roche Urb.Ren.:** William Roche, Urban Renewal Director, advised that the costs of program funding with the breakdowns would be submitted at the Urban Renewal meeting on 6/18/74 in the Urban Renewal Office.
- Firehouse:** Mayor Fitzgerald questioned Trustee Wilson if the Fire Department might be interested in locating at the corner of William and Canal Streets to house its equipment. Mayor Fitzgerald commented that there is a possibility that clearance from HUD would allow a structure of this nature in this spot.
- Rev.Shar. Report:** Trustee Strong briefed the board on his recent trip to Washington to attend a seminar relative to the allocation of the revenue sharing funds. In essence, he advised, funds are available from the government for funding for the fire department, police offices, community center as well as village and town offices.
- Landfill:** Attorney Poyzer advised that the deeds describing the boundary lines of the landfill are not accurate. A boundary line agreement should be drawn with the owners of the properties whose lands border the landfill.
- Permissive Wat.Dist.** Attorney Poyzer commented that she had written a letter to Albany relative to the proper procedure to follow relative to the extension of the village water line outside the village limits where there is no water district formed. In the past it has been the practice to have those desiring water, to install their own water lines, pay for repairs, and the village could charge 3 times the village rate for usage, with a stipulation in the agreement that the users would only be getting a surplus of the water. Another possible route would be that the town could form a water district. Trustee Strong was asked to contact the town to ascertain if they would be interested in forming a water district on the east section of Vienna Street which now converges at a point with East Main Street or Route #31 before entering the village limits. (All of the above is in conjunction with the development of Cady & Mate Funeral Home at this "flat-iron intersection", which area does have water but is outside of the village limits).
- Local Law #4:** Attorney Poyzer advised that a public hearing should be held relative to the adoption of a numbering system assigned to ordinances and local laws in the Code of the Village of Palmyra as numbered by the General Code Publishers. Motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried that a public hearing date be set as of July 15, 1974 and said Local Law on desks of Board members as of this date. 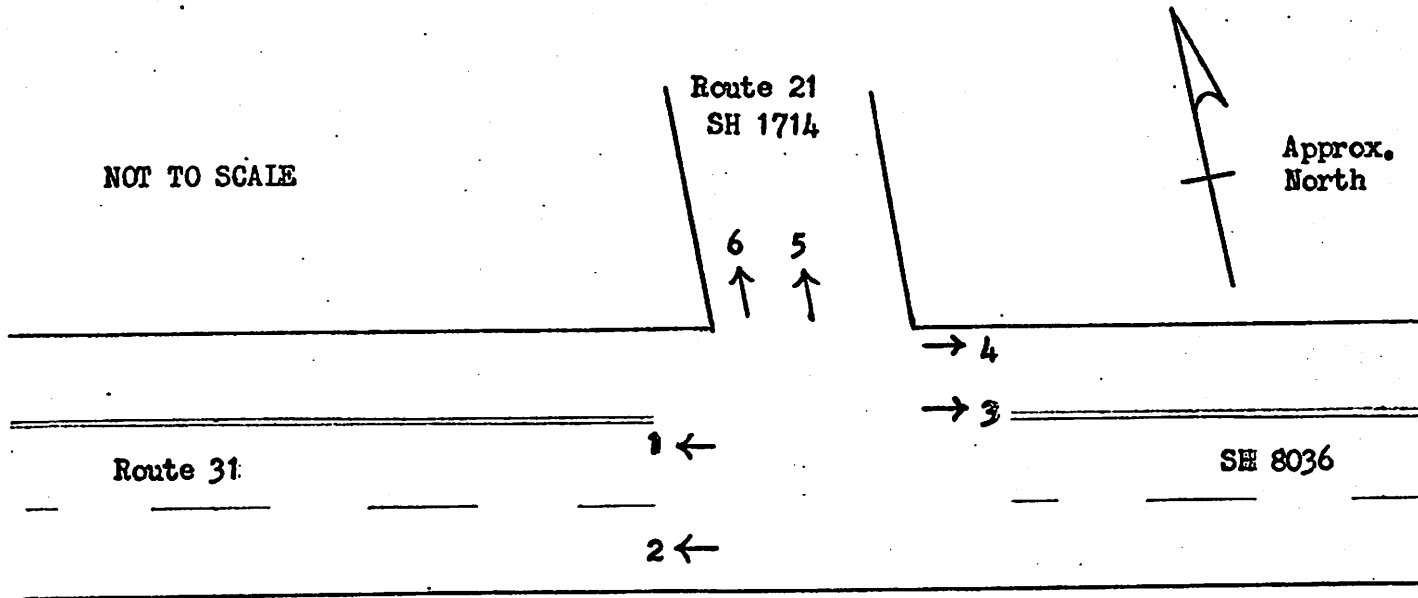
