that the Owner and the Contractor, for the considerations hereafter named
agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor hereby agrees to furnish all supplies, materials, work,
labor, equipment and transportation, and perform all work for the
SANITARY SEWER EXTENSION AND PUMPING STATION all in strict
accordance with the requirements and provisions of the Contract Documents,
as defined in the General Conditions, which are hereby made part of this
Agreement:

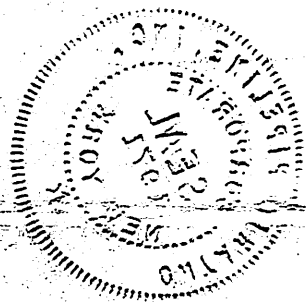

Regular Board Meeting July 1, 1974
Board of Trustees

7:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald, and Trustees Lloyd A. Green, Mary Lou Wilson, Warner Strong. Absent, Trustee David McGuire.

2 Min. Silence: Mayor Fitzgerald opened the meeting with a two minute silence.

Vouchers: Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, to approve payment of the vouchers in the amount of \$11,051.50.

Minutes: Board deferred accepting the minutes of the meeting of 6/17/74, in view of the fact that board members advised that they had not received the minutes until July 1st, although clerk advised they were mailed on Friday, June 28th.

Police Report: Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Strong and carried, to accept the Police Report for the month of June, 1974. Highlights of the report indicated 193 complaints, 3 arrests for disorderly conduct, eleven speeders apprehended along with 5 arrests for driving while intoxicated. Fines and bail forfeitures amounted to \$341.00.

Agree. Ontario Pipe re:Howell E. Fost. Sewer: On the recommendation of Woodward Associates, Webster, New York, agreements for the installation of the sewer line on East Foster to connect with Howell Street, work to be done by Ontario Pipeline, Inc., 1 Grove St., Pittsford, N.Y., were signed and notarized by Mayor Fitzgerald, on approval of the Village Board. Original agreement is so attached.

July 1, 1974

Tennis Ct. Bid: Discussion of the bids received. Trustee Green advised that he has the bids. Motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to table the matter at present.

Landfill: Trustee Green commented that no problems relative to the landfill are insurmountable. Village Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer and Town of Palmyra Attorney Paul Rubery are working on a general agreement relative to lines, etc. Trustee Green further advised that Allen Granger, operator of the landfill for the Village of Palmyra for the last two years, is continuing to help out by caring for the landfill until the matter can be resolved. At the present time the hours are the same as before; namely, 1:00 P.M. - 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, and 8:00 A.M. - 4:00 P.M. on Saturday.

Attorney Poyzer: Attorney Poyzer commented that Town Attorney Rubery has indicated that it would be apropos to have a draft or agreement outlining what the village is going to do and what the town would be expected to do. In the agreement the town would like the village to haul cover until December 31, 1974.

Resol. re: The following resolution was proposed by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Wilson to sell the landfill to the Town of Palmyra:

Landfill: WHEREAS, the Village of Palmyra presently owns two parcels of property located on the east and west sides of Garnsey Road in the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, which parcels were acquired by three deeds as follows: (1) a deed from Francis J. McGuire, dated April 24, 1953 and recorded on April 28, 1953 in the Wayne County Clerk's office in Liber 407 of Deeds page 183; and (2) a deed from Lester B. Dobbin, dated January 2, 1953 and recorded on February 6, 1953 in the Wayne County Clerk's office in Liber 404 of Deeds, page 489; and (3) a deed from George S. Gilfus, dated February 3, 1962 and recorded on March 1, 1962 in the Wayne County Clerk's Office in Liber 503 of Deeds, page 369; and, WHEREAS, the Village of Palmyra previously has operated a sanitary landfill on the parcel of land located on the east side of Garnsey Road and has operated a brush landfill and taken dirt from the parcel of land located on the west side of Garnsey Road; and, WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra that said parcels of the property are no longer required to be used for the aforesaid purposes or for any public use of the Village of Palmyra; and, WHEREAS, the Town of Palmyra is desirous of acquiring the aforesaid parcels of property from the Village of Palmyra and of operating the sanitary landfill, for the benefit of the residents of the Town and Village of Palmyra; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the aforesaid properties located on the east and west sides of Garnsey Road in the Town of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, are declared to be no longer required by the Village of Palmyra for the operation of a sanitary and/or brush landfill, or for any public purpose of the Village, and said properties shall be sold and conveyed to the Town of Palmyra.

Water Plant Bid: A letter received by the Village Board from Lozier Engineers, Inc. Rochester, N.Y., advised that they had had a communication from Ontario Pipeline Corp., low bidder for the installation of additions to the Filter Plant on 2/24/74, which bids, including Ontario, were rejected due to the impending Wayne County Study in the spring for a county wide water system, indicating that they, Ontario Pipeline, would be willing to construct the project, if the board so agreed, for the same price as was bid in February.

Refer to Comm. Motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried to refer the matter to the Water Committee.

No More ORDIN. Must do by LOC.LAW: A Special Bulletin received from the New York State Conference of Mayors advised that Chapter 1028 of the Laws of 1974 will become effective as of September 1, 1974 which in essence will rescind the power of the village to enact an ordinance. All proposed rules and regulations from this date on will be in the form of a LOCAL LAW.

Sew.Treat Plant: K.G. Woodward Assoc., Webster, N.Y., engineers for the Sewage Disposal Plant sent a copy of a letter which they had sent to Frank J. Marianacci, Inc., Holcomb, N.Y., contractors for the updating of the sewer plant to include chlorination of the effluent, indicated that a recent check of a few discrepancies had not been corrected and would suggest that they be taken care of. Sewer Plant Operator, Hiram VanEtten, concurred with the information in the letter as of this date.

Info. Transfer: A letter from James L. Sapienza, Esq., attorney for the Village of Macedon, inquired about Cable TV, namely, Information Transfer, who has a non-exclusive franchise with the Village of Palmyra for 12 years expiring in 1982. Board indicated that they have installed the cable well and there have been no complaints with the exception of those people on Kent Street, who are not serviced with the cable due to too few possible connections, with little revenue for the actual cost of installation.

Jerry Griffin: Jerry Griffin, owner and operator of Canaltown Records, on East Main Street, advised the board that he had heard on Channel 13 T.V. that the Salvation Army had funds that would be available for the construction of Community Centers, etc. Board asked him to delve into the matter further and return with more concrete information.

Comm. Ctr.: James DePoint, Esq., newly appointed treasurer of the Community Center and James Campbell, Director, presented a letter to Mayor Fitzgerald in behalf of the Village Board, in which they suggested or recommended various ways of using the Federal Revenue Sharing Funds. Trustee Green questioned if Federal Revenue Funds received by the village could be spent on School Tennis Courts. The school would be happy to receive any funds to refurbish the courts, if such were legal.

Municipal Bldg.: Trustee Strong advised that he had talked with Fire Chief Culver regarding a municipal building to include a community center. Mr. DePoint mentioned the proposal drawn by VanScott Bros. which was handed to Trustee Strong for his perusal. A discussion of the land proposed to be donated by the Palmyra Fair Association located in the southwest corner of their premises, was aired. Trustee Strong suggested that the plan drawn by the Fire Department for possible needs be re-drawn to scale by an architect so that probable costs might be ascertained.

Budget Fds. for Comm.Ctr. Retire.: The following motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green:
WHEREAS, it has been the responsibility of the Palmyra Community Center to repay the Village of Palmyra the approximate sum of \$2,200.00 for the New York State Retirement annual cost based on the salary of James Campbell,
BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Village of Palmyra shall budget the sum of \$250.00 and likewise it is to be assumed that the Town of Palmyra will budget \$250.00 to help defray the cost of the retirement due the 15th of May annually.

Comm.Ctr. Report: The quarterly report of the activities of the Community Center was submitted by Director Campbell. It is to be noted that approximately 6 summer dances are scheduled at the Garlock Rod and Gun Club through the efforts of Trustee Wilson for the teenagers for a nominal charge, although the use of the building, cost of orchestra, and refreshments would be donated, by Garlock. The nominal charge would discourage any so-called gate crashers.

Daniel Pope, Chairman of the Village of Palmyra Planning Board, informed the board that they would not recommend the proposal of the Jaycees to place an Informational outdoor bulletin board in front of the Village Park for the following reasons: (1) the bulletin board would not be an addition to the beauty of the park; (2) there is little pedestrian traffic in this area, and (3) this would be a good target for rock throwing, etc., (4) there would be no control over the board and lastly the planning board and the village board could not allow such a large sign any other place in the village so therefore, it would not be apropos that the village allow it in front of the park.

Architec.
Review
Board:

Mr. Pope advised that the Planning Board is in accord that the Village Board should move in haste to prepare such a review board and regulations. Presently, there is no way that it is possible to preserve the architecture of the village including the downtown area, --- Victorian.

Zon.Ofc.
Wideman:

Zoning Officer Bruce Wideman, suggested that research in other villages would convince the board that an Architectural Review Board is the only solution. Zoning Officer Wideman commented that he knows of an architect who will serve on the board as chairman, and that an architect is a requisite. Motion by Trustee Strong to table the matter of an architectural review board.

Motion died for lack of a second.

Motion was made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Wilson that the powers and rules of an architectural review board be ready within 30 days and within 45 days names be submitted for appointment by the village board.

Chairman Pope advised that the Planning Board would recommend changing the zoning district map and changing to C-1 the area which forms a flat-iron appearance from the corner of Canal & Park Drive to include the Palmyra Home Diner, west to include all the farm machinery business of John Blazey, thence south, crossing East Main Street to include the Hansel Liquor Store, thence east to include the former Agway Bldg., thence north to the Palmyra Home Diner.

Motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to request the Village Attorney, Laura Jane Poyzer, to prepare the necessary Local Law for adoption, following the proper public hearing.

Taxes:

Attorney Poyzer commented that she had had a call from James Foley, Esq., relative to a Tax Sale Certificate that the Village of Palmyra is holding on the property at 128 Market Street. Clerk reviewed the incident relative to a fire on 12/19/64 in which 6 persons died. Ultimately, the debris that was left from the fire was a dangerous hazard and in view of the fact that the owner of the property was incompetent, in the state hospital at Willard, it was deemed advisable to remove the debris and fill the area in with gravel. Work was done by village crews for a cost of \$293.50. Eventually the unpaid bill along with village taxes were unpaid and according to State Village Law following the proper Tax Sale of the Treasurer in March, said taxes were filed as a lien against the property by the Village of Palmyra.

Attorney Poyzer commented that Attorney Foley had indicated that they would pay 1/2 of the bills owed or about \$250.00 and not the \$495.00 as owed.

Motion was made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Strong and carried, to accept one-half (1/2) of the actual amount owed.
