Mr. Dohse moved that the period for purchasing gasoline, oil, and supplies from local dealers be extended to a six month period instead of a two month period, effective April 1st, 1951, seconded by Mr. Webster, and on motion, carried.

No further business appearing the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Dohse, seconded by Mr. Webster, same were approved.

of such violation, fifty cents (\$.50) for each violation of this ordinance. The failure of such owner or operator to make such payment within seventy-two (72) hours, shall render such owner or operator subject to the penalties hereinafter provided for a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION XVII. All parking meter spaces shall be so marked so that no vehicle will be required to park in violation of Section 86.7 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

SECTION XVIII. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this ordinance, and any person who aids, abets or assists therein shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars, and shall stand committed until said fine be paid, but not exceeding one day for each dollar of such fine unpaid.

SECTION XIX. In the event of a public emergency, the President of the Village of Palmyra, or the Chief of Police of the Village of Palmyra, shall have the power to suspend the operation of the provisions of this ordinance for the duration of such emergency.

SECTION XX. If any section of this ordinance, or part thereof shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION XXI. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Village of Palmyra in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION XXII. This ordinance shall take effect the 16th day of April, 1951, after due publication and posting in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Village of Palmyra.

SECTION XIV. The coins required to be deposited in said parking meters as herein provided are levied and assessed as fees to provide for the proper regulation and control of traffic upon the public streets of this village, and also the cost of providing and regulating the parking of vehicles in the parking meter zones hereby created and to cover the cost of the purchase, operation and maintenance, control and use of said parking meters, and any surplus of monies over and above what may be required for the above purposes shall be transferred to or used for such purpose or purposes as the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra may determine.

SECTION XV. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle to be parked or standing at any time within any of the zones designated in Section II of this ordinance for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any article or commodity, or for the purpose of soliciting, accepting or attempting to solicit orders for any article or commodity.

SECTION XVI. It shall be the duty of the police officers of the Village of Palmyra to report to the Chief of Police or Officer in Charge:

- (a) The number of each parking meter which indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent to such meter is or has been parked in violation of any provision of this ordinance.
- (b) The state and license number of such vehicle.
- (c) Any other facts relating to such violation.
- (d) The police officer observing such violation shall also attach to such vehicle a notice to the owner or operator thereof that such vehicle has been parked or has remained in violation of the provisions of this ordinance. Each such owner or operator of such vehicle, shall within seventy-two (72) hours of the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay to the Village Clerk, or his deputy, during his regular office hours, or such other officer or official as the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra may designate, as a penalty for and in full satisfaction

SECTION IX. Commercial trucks may park in the parking meter spaces to load or to unload merchandise, without depositing coins for such period required for such loading or unloading. Should any such truck be so parked for a period longer than that required for loading or unloading merchandise it shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION X. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for any person to cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in the name of or operated by such person to be parked overtime or beyond the period of parking time established for any parking space within such zones.

SECTION XI. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for any person to permit a vehicle to remain or to be placed in any parking space adjacent to any parking meter while said meter is displaying a signal indicating that the vehicle occupying such space has already occupied it beyond the period of time prescribed for such parking space.

SECTION XII. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this ordinance for any person to park a vehicle in any such space except during the unexpired parking period as indicated by the parking meter controlling such parking space.

SECTION XIII. The Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra shall designate a police officer or other official of the Village of Palmyra, or it may designate and appoint a person or bank of its selection, any such designation or appointment may be revoked by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra at any time for any cause whatsoever, whose duty it shall be to periodically collect the coins deposited in such parking meters and to render a written signed account for each collection and pay the same over to the Village Treasurer who shall keep same in a special account to be designated "Parking Meter Account", and be disbursed only upon the written order or direction of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra.

for a period not longer than thirty-six minutes, or four such coins of one cent each, which shall entitle his vehicle to be parked therein for a period not longer than forty-eight minutes, or five such coins of one cent each or a United States coin of five cents, which shall entitle his vehicle to be parked therein for a period not longer than sixty minutes or one hour, or a United States coin of five cents and five such coins of one cent each or two United States coins of five cents each, which shall entitle his vehicle to be parked therein for a period not longer than one hundred twenty minutes or two hours. If said vehicle shall occupy the parking space beyond the time limits as hereinbefore set forth and paid for by the operator, the parking meter shall by proper sign or legend indicate illegal occupancy of such space and in that event shall be considered as parking overtime and beyond the period of legal parking time, and the occupancy of such space by the vehicle beyond the period of legal parking time shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

(c) The maximum parking time for legal continuous parking in any one metered space shall be limited and restricted to a period of not longer than two hours at a time and nothing herein contained shall permit the purchase from time to time of a longer period of continuous parking in such space.

SECTION VI. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter any slug, token, devise or metallic substitute for a coin of the United States.

SECTION VII. It shall be unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this ordinance for any person to deface, injure, tamper with, open, or wilfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION VIII. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as prohibiting the Board of Trustees from providing for free parking space for bus stops and for taxi cab stands, provided proper designating signs are erected and maintained in such spaces, and there shall be no parking in such spaces except by the vehicles so designated.

(c) On the west side of Fayette Street between East Main Street and a point two hundred twenty-five (225) feet measured southerly from the south line of the sidewalk as now laid down at the southwest corner of East Main Street and Fayette Street.

Section IV. Within the zones designated in Section II of this ordinance, the Board of Trustees may cause a parking meter to be installed in each parking space in such zone or zones upon or near the curb immediately adjacent to the individual parking space as designated by lines marked on the pavement or street. Vehicles shall be parked diagonal to the curb and with the front part of such vehicle next to the curb on East Main Street on the north side from its intersection with Church Street to its intersection with Market Street, and on the south side of East Main Street from its intersection with Canandaigua Street to its intersection with Fayette Street, and within all other zones or portions thereof designated in Section II, vehicles shall be parked only parallel with the curb or sidewalk, headed in the direction of traffic, and with front and rear wheels not more than six inches from the curb. The parking or standing of any vehicle except within a space so marked within any of said zones and in the manner above set forth is hereby prohibited.

SECTION V. (a) Parking meters installed in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance shall be used and the time limits hereinafter provided shall be effective all days between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 6:00 P. M. (prevailing time) on Monday through Friday, and on Saturday between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 6:00 P. M. (prevailing time), with the exception of Sundays and the following holidays, namely: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, the Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

(b) When any vehicle shall be parked in a parking meter space, the owner or operator of said vehicle upon entering said parking meter space shall immediately deposit in such parking meter a United States coin of one cent which shall entitle his vehicle to be parked therein for a period of not longer than twelve minutes or two such coins of one cent each, which shall entitle his vehicle to be parked therein for a period of not longer than twenty-four minutes, or three such coins of one cent each, which shall entitle his vehicle to be parked therein

RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, pursuant to the authority granted to said Board of Trustees by the Charter of said Village and pursuant to the applicable statutes of the State of New York, that the following ORDINANCE be and the same hereby is adopted and duly enacted this 13th day of February, 1951:

SECTION I. The words and terms used in this ordinance unless otherwise expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires, shall have the same meaning as defined in the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

SECTION II. The following streets or portions of said streets are hereby designated as limited parking and parking meter zones:

(a) East Main Street on the north side from its intersection with Canandaigua Street to the west line of Mill Street.

(b) East Main Street on the south side from its intersection with Canandaigua Street to the west line of Mill Street.

(c) William Street on both sides from East Main Street to Canal Street.

(d) Market Street on the east side from East Main Street to Canal Street.

(e) Clinton Street on the east side from East Main Street to Canal Street.

(f) Fayette Street on the east side from East Main Street to East Jackson Street, and on the west side from a point two hundred twenty-five (225) feet south of the south edge of the sidewalk as now laid down at the southwest corner of East Main Street and Fayette Street, to East Jackson Street.

(g) Cuyler Street from East Main Street to East Jackson Street on both sides.

SECTION III. The parking or standing of vehicles in any of the following locations at any time is hereby prohibited:

(a) On the west side of Market Street between East Main Street and Canal Street.

(b) On the west side of Clinton Street between East Main Street and Canal Street.

Resolution offered by Trustee Mosher, who moved its adoption, and seconded by Trustee Dohse:

WHEREAS, traffic conditions which have existed in the Village of Palmyra for a considerable period of time, impede and delay the free movement of traffic by motor vehicles in that area of the said Village of Palmyra used for business or commercial purposes; and

WHEREAS, various attempts to regulate traffic and parking in the business or commercial area of this village over the past several years have not solved this traffic problem; and

WHEREAS, due to numerous operators of motor vehicles parking for long periods of time in one location, and other operators of motor vehicles parking for long periods of time in close proximity to other motor vehicles so parked on the streets in the business area of the village, which further impedes the flow and movement of traffic, and in addition constitutes a condition dangerous to the life and property of motorists, pedestrians and the general public; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board of Trustees of this Village, after various surveys of traffic in this Village, and observations of traffic in other communities in this area, that the aforesaid traffic conditions may be remedied to a substantial extent by installing and providing for mechanical parking meters and thereby limiting parking in the business or commercial area of the Village to reasonable intervals of time and by compelling operators of motor vehicles who use the parking spaces in this area of the Village to pay a portion of the cost of establishing and maintaining such parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, at a referendum held by the Village of Palmyra recently, this Board of Trustees submitted to the voters of this Village the proposition of whether parking meters should be installed or not, and 133 voters approved the installation of parking meters, and 99 voters disapproved; be it

Ordinance re: Trailer coach parks

A dopted, April 25, 1951.

At a Special meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, duly held on April 25th, 1951, at 5 o'clock P. M., and at which a majority of the members of said Board were present, the following resolution was duly adopted:

WHEREAS, from time to time, protests and complaints have been made to this Board of Trustees by various inhabitants of the Village of Palmyra, complaining of the health and sanitation conditions existing in and about various locations where trailer coach parks have been established; and

WHEREAS, due to the fact that the Village of Palmyra is substantially fully laid out and developed and built up to the point where there is little vacant space, and an adequate means of disposing of sewage and waste is not available in most locations,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, New York, by virtue of the power and authority given it by the Charter of said Village and the laws of the State of New York, and for the purpose of providing for the public health and welfare of the community, and the better policing of the community, does hereby enact the following ordinance relating to trailer coach parks in the Village of Palmyra:

Section 1. Title.

This ordinance shall be known as the Trailer Ordinance of the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York.

Section 2. Definitions.

As used in this ordinance:

(a) "Person" means any natural individual, firm, partner, corporation or association of persons, and the singular number shall include the plural number.

(b) "Trailer coach" means any portable structure or vehicle so constructed or designed as to permit occupancy thereof for dwelling or sleeping purposes.

(c) "Trailer coach park" means any plot of ground upon which two or more trailer coaches occupied or used for dwelling or sleeping purposes are located.

Section 3. Prohibitions.

It shall be unlawful for any person to establish or construct a trailer coach park within the limits of the Village of Palmyra after the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 4. Penalty

Any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.00 for each offense. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

The foregoing ordinance shall be entered in the minutes of this special meeting held this 25th day of April, 1951, published for two consecutive weeks in the Palmyra Courier Journal, a weekly newspaper published in the Village of Palmyra, and the official newspaper of the Village of Palmyra, commencing with the publication of May 3rd, 1951, and that printed copies thereof be posted conspicuously in six public places in the Village of Palmyra not later than the date of the first publication of this ordinance, and proof of such publication and posting shall be spread in full upon the book of ordinances of this village, and said ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication and posting for the time and in the manner above provided, but this ordinance shall be effective from and after this date as a-
