The w/ww truck was discussed for ACO use, however, Trustee Wooden noted that possibly another truck, an older truck. See what extra vehicle the highway dept. had and wanted to give up for ACO use. Trustee Drews asked if the VOP had ever supplied a vehicle to ACO before? Mayor Elliott and Trustee Wooden said NO. ACO would probably park the vehicle at home said Mayor Elliott.
