





R.Peterson After Mr. Peterson showed the slides, he advised that in Comments: order to bring the Village of Palmyra dump up to the standards as set by the New York State Department of Health, the cost would be approximately \$50,000.00. At the present time, he reiterated there are 13 dump areas in Wayne County. If Wayne County were to assume the responsibility of dump areas, there are 3 sites that might be procured for use. A user fee would or might be charged at 50¢/cubic yard to defray operating cost of approximately \$150,000.00 per year; The cost to the Village of Palmyra for its share of the repayment of the \$30,000.00 Bond issue would be about Possible Cost: \$2,800.00 per year for 15 years.
