There having been presented to this Board of Health, the report of Dr. James D. Bramer, Health Officer of the Village of Palmyra, New York, dated August 31st, 1951, a report of an alleged nuisance on the premises designated No. 132 Gates Street, in the Village of Palmyra, New York, together with a copy of a written complaint made to him as such health officer, and said health officer in said report having set forth that the condition complained of and which he investigated was in his opinion a public hazard and a nuisance to public health for the reasons set forth in his said report of August 31, 1951; and

Now, by virtue of the authority vested in this Board of Health pursuant to the Public Health Law of the State of New York, the Charter of the Village of Palmyra and the Sanktary Code of the State of New York, said Howard Young be and he hereby is ORDERED to abate said nuisance by cleaning and putting the present septic tank and all inlets and outlets to same in working order and constructing additional outlets for the disposal of the overflow from said tank if same be necessary in the opinion of the Health Officer, and filling in the holes and pits now existing on said

premises, and in the event a new or larger septic tank is required to adequately dispose of the sewage, that such tank be constructed or installed with proper connections to the same by October 23rd, 1951, in a manner which shall be approved by Dr. James D. Bramer, Health Officer of the Village of Palmyra, and by this Board of Health, and in the event of said Howard Young failing to comply with this order as above provided, that this Board of Health will by its own employees or otherwise enter upon said premises and suppress such nuisance and charge the expense thereof to the said Howard Young, and in the event of his failure to pay the same promptly, this Board of Health will maintain an action in the name of the Village of Palmyra to recover such expense and take any further steps it deems necessary to recover such expense.

#### LEGAL NOTICE

WHEREAS, a substantial number of people patronize eating establishments in the Village of Palmyra each day, and it is essential that such establishments serve food and drink which is clean and wholesome, and that the persons who operate and work in such public eating places be in good health;

WHEREAS, the local health officer has informed this Board that it would in his opinion after various inspections he has made of eating establishments in the Village, be in the interest of the health of this community to establish by ordinance regulations governing the operation of such eating places and the persons operating same and the persons employed therein; be it

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RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, pursuant to the authority granted to said Board of Trustees by the Charter of said Village and pursuant to the applicable statutes of the State of New York, and in the safeguarding of the general health and welfare of the residents of this community, that the following ORDINANCE be and the same is adopted and duly enacted this 28 day of December, 1951:

#### ORDINANCE REGULATING . RESTAURANTS

Section 1. Definitions - The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and the enforcement of this ordinance:

A. Restaurant - The term "restaurant" shall apply to and include any restaurant, coffee shop, cafe, hotel, tavern, luncheonette, sandwich shop, soda fountain and all other eating or drinking establishments in which food and drink, or either of them, is prepared, made, mixed or served to the general published location or place of business for more than five (5) days in any one calendar year in the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York. lic, at a fixed or regularly estab-

B. Person - The term "person" shall apply to and include any person, co-partnership, firm, corpora-

tion or association. C. Employee - The term "employee" shall mean any person who handles, serves, prepares or mixes any food or drink or who is em-ployed or works, either for wages or otherwise, in any restaurant to which this ordinance applies.

D. Utensils - The term "utensils" shall include any kitchenware, tableware, glassware, cutlery, utensils, containers or other equipment with which food or drink comes in contact during storage, prepara-

tion or serving. E. Health Officer - The term "health officer" shall include in addition to the Health Officer of the Village of Palmyra, New York, the acting health officer of said village, or the duly authorized representative of either.

may be taken and examined by the dal process immediately following health officer as often as may be the day's operation. Drying cloths necessary for the detection of unwholesomeness or adulteration. The used for no other purpose. health officer may condemn and forbid the sale of, or cause to be removed or destroyed, any food or drink which is unwholesome or adulterated.

Section 3. Inspection of restaurants - At least once every six (6) months, the health officer shall inspect every restaurant within the Village of Palmyra. The person operating any restaurant and any employee of such restaurant or es tablishment shall, upon request of the health officer, permit access to all parts of his restaurant or establishment, and shall submit to the health officer on request any and all records of food purchased.

Section 4. Sanitation requirements - All restaurants shall com-

A. Rooms and structures. The floors, walls, ceilings, doors and windows of all rooms in which food or drink is stored, prepared or served, or in which utensils are washed shall be kept clean and in good repair, well lighted and ventilated.

B. Toilet, lavatory and water. Every restaurant shall be provided with adequate toilet and lavatory facilities for its employees. Toilet rooms shall be kept in a clean condition, in good repair, and well lighted and ventilated. Hand washing signs shall be posted in each G. Cleanliness of employees toilet room used by employees All employees shall wear clean Adequate and convenient hand washing facilities shall be provided, hands clean at all times while enincluding running water under pressure, soap and approved san-itary towels. The use of a common towel is prohibited. No employee shall resume work after using the toilet room without first washing his hands.

C. Construction of utensils and equipment - All multi-use utensils and all show and display cases or windows, counters, shelves, tables, refrigeration equipment, sinks, and other equipment or utensils used in connection with the operation of a restaurant shall be so constructed as to be easily cleaned and shall be kept in good repair. Utensils containing or plated with cadmium or lead shall not be used: Provided, That solder containing lead may be used for jointing.

D. Cleaning and bactericidal treatment of utensils and equipment - All equipment, including display cases or windows, counters, tables. refrigerators. shelves, tables, refrigerators, stoves, hoods and sinks, shall be kept clean and free from dust, dirt, insects and other contaminating material. All cloths used by waiters, chefs, and other employees shall be clean. Single-service containers shall be used only once.

All multi-use eating and drink-ing utensils shall be thoroughly cleaned and effectively subjected to an approved bactericidal process after each usage. All multi-use Section 2. Examination and condemnation of unwholesome or adul-serving of food and drink shall be as may be indicated.

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No article, polish or other sub stance containing any cyanide preparation or other poisonous material shall be used for cleansing

or polishing utensils.

E. Refrigeration - All readily perishable food and drink shall be kept at or below 50 degrees F. except when being prepared or served. Waste water from refrigeration equipment shall be properly disposed of.

F. Wholesomeness of food and drink - All food and drink shall be clean, wholesome, free from spoilage, and so prepared as to be safe for human consumption. All milk fluid milk products, ice cream, and other frozen desserts shall be served from approved sources. Milk and ply with the following items of fluid milk products shall be sersanitation: tainers in which they are received from the distributor or from a bulk container equipped with an approved dispensing devise: Pro-vided, that this requirement shall not apply to cream, which may be served from the original bottle or from a dispenser approved for such service. All oysters, clams and mussels shall be from approved sources and if shucked shall be kept until used in the containers in which they were placed at the shucking plant.

H. Miscellaneous - The premises of all restaurants shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish. None of the operations connection with a restaurant shall be conducted in any room used as living or sleeping quarters.

Section 5. Disease control. - No person who is affected with any disease in a communicable form or is a carrier of such disease shall work in any restaurant, and no restaurant shall employ any such person or any person suspected of being a carrier of such disease. If the restaurant has reasonable cause to believe that any employee has contracted any disease in a communicable form or has become a carrier of such disease, he shall notify the health officer immediately. When the health officer has reasonable cause to believe that disease or infection may be transmitted from any restaurant operator or employee, he is authorized to require any or all of the follow-ing measures: (1) the immediate exclusion of the employee from all restaurants; (2) the immediate closing of the restaurant concerned until no further danger of disease outbreak exists, in the opinion of the health officer; (3) adequate medical examination of the employee and of his associates, with such laboratory examinations

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Section 6. Penalties - Any persubjected to an approved bacterici- son who shall violate any provision dal process immediately following of this Ordinance, and any person who aids, abets or assists therein shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and shall stand com-mitted until said fine be paid, but not exceeding one day for each dollar of such fine unpaid. Each violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

> Section 7. Unconstitutionality -If any section of this ordinance, or part thereof shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.

> Section 8. Date of Effect - This ordinance shall take effect the 1st day of February, 1952, after due publication and posting. In accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Village of Palmyra.
