> ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING, ETC., ON CERTAIN PUBLIC STREETS IN THE VILLAGE OF PALMYRA, NEW YORK, AMENDING ORDINANCE ADOPTED JUNE 21, 1949.

RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, New York, by virtue of the power and authority given it by the Charter of said Village and the laws of the State of New York, and for the safety of the general public and the better regulation of vehicular traffic, does hereby amend the Ordinance heretofore enacted by the Board of Trustees of this Village on June 21, 1949, relating to parking, etc., on certain public streets in said Village of Palmyra, by inserting in said ordinance a new section to be known and designated Section 5-A, and does enact, ordain and declare the following section to be added to said ordinance:

Section 5-A. No vehicle of any description shall be parked or standing at any time on the north side of Charlotte Avenue East between Canandaigua Street and Cuyler Street, and there shall be erected by the village signs prohibiting such parking or standing.

And it is further

RESOLVED, that the foregoing amendment to the Ordinance duly enacted on June 21, 1949 shall be entered in the minutes of this meeting held this 26th day of September, 1950, and published for two consecutive weeks in the Palmyra Courier-Journal, a weekly newspaper published in the Village of Palmyra, New York, and the official newspaper of this Board of Trustees, commencing with the first publication succeeding this date, and that printed copies thereof be posted conspicuously in six public places in the Village of Palmyra not later than the date of the first publication of said amended order. The proof of such publication and posting shall be spread in full upon the Book of Ordinances of this Village, and same shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication and posting for the time and in the manner above provided.

WHEREAS, this Village has recently purchased a new fire truck and equipment; and

WHEREAS, at the last regular village election duly held on April 4th, 1950, a proposition was submitted to the qualified voters of this village as follows:

"Shall a new fire truck and equipment be purchased at a cost of not more than \$13,500.00, the sum of \$9,000.00 to be taken from the General Special Fund, and the balance from the Capital Reserve Fund - Fire?"

and which said proposition was duly approved, 79 votes having been cast in favor thereof, 8 votes against the adoption of said proposition,

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, that the sum of \$4,500.00 be withdrawn from said Capital Reserve Fund - Fire, and paid to-ward the purchase price of the above fire truck and equipment, and the Village Clerk and Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized and directed to carry out such withdrawal and payment and the Palmyra Office of the Union Trust Company of Rochester is hereby authorized and directed to honor a draft or other order for said sum of \$4,500.00 drawn by the proper village officials against said fund upon being presented with a certified copy of this resolution.
