

DETERMINATION AND ORDER PURSUANT THE PROVISIONS
OF SECTION 147 OF THE VILLAGE LAW

WHEREAS, pursuant the provisions of Section 146 of the Village Law, a public hearing was held by the Village Board of the Village of Palmyra on the 10th day of May, 1971, in relation to the question of the abandonment of certain portions of village streets hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, due notice was served on all interested parties, or, in the alternative, said parties waived said notice, and

WHEREAS, after hearing all the evidence and testimony presented at said public hearing the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra does hereby make the following determination:

RESOLVED, that the following described portions of "Sexton Street" and "Jackson Street", as laid out by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra on the 4th day of August, 1869, i.e.,

Sexton Street

Commencing at an iron pipe in the southerly line of Prospect Drive in the Village of Palmyra, County of Wayne and State of New York, which iron pipe is located at the north-easterly tip of a triangle of land heretofore conveyed to one Bloom; thence (1) South 10 degrees 00' 50" West, passing through a cement monument 52.67 feet and continuing on the same course crossing what was formerly Jackson Street in said Village of Palmyra (a distance of 66 feet from the last mentoned point) and continuing on the same course along lands now or formerly of one Bloom to a point in the southerly boundary of lands conveyed to Richard Porter Bloom and Sarah Middlebrook Bloom by deed dated May 25, 1927 and recorded May 31, 1927, in the Wayne County Clerk's Office in Liber 281 of Deeds at page 424; thence (2)

Easterly along the southerly line of said Bloom, a distance of 50 feet to a point; thence (3) North 10 degrees 00' 50" East to the premises of one Bloom passing through lands now or formerly devised to the Village of Palmyra by the late Pliny T. Sexton, 50 feet distant from the first course and parallel thereto to a point where said line intersects with the southerly line of Prospect Drive in said Village; thence (4) South 44 degrees 12' 10" West along the southerly boundary of Prospect Drive to the point and place of beginning, reference being made to a survey of Harnish and Lookup, dated February 11, 1971, entitled "Plan of Land to be conveyed by Sarah M. Bloom Estate in Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York".

Jackson Street

Commencing at a point where the easterly boundary of Prospect Drive intersects with the northerly boundary of one Bloom, which was also the southerly boundary of a street known as Jackson Street in the Village of Palmyra and so dedicated; thence (1) South 80 degrees 16' 20" East along the lands of said Bloom and others passing through an iron pipe set 105.09 feet distant therefrom and continuing on the same course 25 feet for a total distance of 130.09 feet to a point; thence (2) North 10 degrees 00' 50" East a distance of 66 feet to a point; thence (3) North 80 degrees 16' 20" West passing through a concrete monument 50 feet distant from the last mentioned point and continuing on the same course 35.90 feet to an iron pipe set in the easterly boundary of Prospect Drive for a total distance of 85.90 feet; thence (4) South 44 degrees 12' 10" West a distance of 80.06 feet along the easterly boundary of Prospect Drive to the point and place of beginning, reference being made to a survey of Harnish and Lookup, dated February 11, 1971, entitled "Plan of Land to be conveyed by Sarah M. Bloom Estate in the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York",

have, for all practical purposes, been abandoned by the public for many years as streets; that there is no evidence of public travel on said portions of said streets, and said street areas have no practical roadway for the traveling public, that the Village of Palmyra has not for many years maintained said portions of said streets nor has made any improvements thereon, and that a discontinuance of said portions of said streets will not in any manner create a hardship on the interested parties or the public in general, and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra do further,

RESOLVE that the said portions of "Sexton Street" and "Jackson Street" as so laid out by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra as aforesaid be and they hereby are discontinued as public streets of the Village of Palmyra and the public use as public streets is ordered abandoned, and it is further,

Present: Mayor David M. Nussbaumer and Trustees Lloyd A. Green, Donald Sinclair, Frederick Alderman. Absent Trustee Donald Leysath.

Vouchers: On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried, approval for the payment of vouchers in the amount of \$4,508.02 was given to the treasurer.

Park & Club Rms.: Harry Beach & Kermit Jones, members of the Palmyra Fire Department, discussed with the board the renovation of the second floor apartment for the use of the fire company as meeting rooms in the Park & Club Bldg. They questioned after viewing the rooms whether or not they would lend easily for removing the walls to make a larger room, rather than having several small rooms. The board suggested that they table the matter for 3 or 4 weeks when the board might be able to arrive at a solution after study of the use of the rooms by various groups in general.

Fire Phones: Trustee Alderman previously had been approached by the fire department for the addition of more fire phone monitors. The main problem seemed to stem from the absence of coverage after 4:00 or 5:00 P.M. at Garlock, Inc., when the Pinkerton Guards are in charge of security at the Garlock plant. In view of this the fire department felt that additional phones, two or four might be needed, the cost of which would amount to well over \$100.00. In discussing the matter the consensus of the board seemed to be that a study might be made to ascertain if it might be possible to have one common phone from a central dispatcher with one common number which could be called to report a fire, call for oxygen and call for an ambulance.

Prospect Hill: Mrs. Lois Lynch along with David Shulters and David Walton suggested to the board that these young men might be allowed to continue the clean-up of Prospect Hill Park. The boys, according to Trustee Alderman, had been working diligently over the past weekend to try to tidy up the area. Mrs. Lynch mentioned that rubbish cans are needed to deposit cans and debris. They suggested that they would volunteer to do the work. If after the work was done and the village found it satisfactory, perhaps remuneration could be arranged.

Renovat. Vil. Hall Bid. Open: The proof of publication requesting bids on the renovation of the main hallway on the first floor along with remodeling of the Police Office and the installation of proper rest room facilities in the Village Hall were opened at 7:30 P.M.

Attorney Nesbitt described the area in question as being positioned in a northwest base point of Prospect Hill, which formed a right angle. In 1930 in order to obliterate such a sharp right angle turn, a piece of property belonging to Garlock, Inc. was purchased even more to the northwest in order to form a rolling curve and the connection of East Jackson at the point of Fayette to the point of Mill and Vienna Street was renamed to Prospect Drive. The synopsis as related by Attorney Nesbitt was summed up with the recommendation that the village board resolve to abandon this triangular area. He further suggested that a quit claim deed be given to the heirs of the Bloom Estate.

Re-Convene Regular Board Meeting

8:25 P.M.

Re-Convene: On motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Green, and carried, Mayor Nussbaumer re-convened the regular board meeting of May 10, 1971.

Parking: A public hearing will be forthcoming relative to two hour (2 Hr.) parking on the Main Street business area between streets to be decided.

Weykman Bldg. : Attorney Nesbitt advised that he had been asked by the owners of the "Place" on Market Street, Don McGuire, to view the rear of the Weykman Bldg. which faces on Main Street. The Weykman Bldg. on the rear is deteriorating rapidly, with bricks and pieces of wood ready to collapse momentarily. It would be Attorney Nesbitt's suggestion that specs for the demolition of the building be obtained within the near future.

Fayette St. : Attorney Nesbitt advised that a hearing would be in order to regulate one-way traffic from Foster Street to Jackson Street north with the No-Stop Sign ordinance at the corner of Fayette and East Foster to be removed.

One-Way?

Abandon Erie Canal: Letters from Wahl, Fisher and Goosen, residents of West Main Street propose to purchase the land back of their property known as the former Erie Canal. Word has it that Howard VanBortle, owner of the Palmyra Motors and the apartment house directly adjacent to the east of the Palmyra Motors and next to the property of Mrs. Goosen, would also like to purchase some of the Erie Canal land. Motion was made by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried to sell the parcels of land to the interested residents as follows:

Parcel #1 to Mrs. Goosen for \$150.00 (Abram)
Parcel #2 to Mr. Edw. Fisher for \$100.00
Parcel #3 to Mr. Clifford Wahl for \$100.00

Plan. Brd.: A letter was received from the Planning Board recommending the change of zoning in connection with allowing multiple housing in a residential area by special permit. It was their feeling that the wording should be revised to disallow more than two family dwelling in an already populated residential area.

Legal Fees: Clerk informed the board that a bill in the amount of \$1,540.37 had been received from Wiser, Shaw, Freeman, in Rochester for their services in behalf of the Zoning Board of Appeals relative to the legal action instigated by Roche-Kimberly due to a denial by the Zoning Board for a Special Permit to construct Town-House Apartments in an area zoned R-1. A previous village board on 12/1/69 had moved to obtain legal counsel.

Motion to Pay: The following motion to acknowledge payment of this bill was made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair.

RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra shall acknowledge payment of the amount of \$1,540.37 as legal fees in behalf of the Zoning Board of Appeals in connection with the suit instigated by Roche-Kimberly against the Zoning Board of Appeals as of December, 1969. On vote:

Lozier Assoc.: Representatives of Lozier Associates, Consulting Engineers, Wayne Ackert and Dave Thomas advised the village board that they have 85 in their employ, and 60 years of experience in engineering, with about 750 municipalities in the state of New York who avail themselves of their services. To mention a few, were the Town of Williamson, Town of Sodus, Town of Manchester and Shortsville and the City of Canandaigua.

Water Line Discuss.:

They mentioned that air and vacuum vales are placed on top of hills on water lines. A discussion of the pump at Canandaigua Lake was instigated and revealed that at the time of the approval by the State Water Control Commission of the 3,000,000 gallons per day was approved it was recommended that a Pumping Station be planned and erected. The matter of the contract with the Town of Manchester was aired although the Town of Manchester has not had occasion to use the water line to which they attached several years ago.

Inspect Line:

Dave Thomas advised that they would suggest that the board grant them permission to allow Lozier to review the line, filter plant pump station at Canandaigua Lake as well as the village lines. Consensus seemed to be that this was a worthy suggestion.

Stone for Streets: Oil:

Trustee Alderman suggested that 1,000 ton of stone could be hauled from C.M.I. at a cost of \$3,000.00 (to be hauled periodically by them, rather than our trucks). Trustee Alderman has estimated that about 79,000 sq. yds. need to be covered with oil at a cost of 25¢/gal. (Koppers) which entails 4 gals. to cover a square yard.

Curbs:

Trustee Alderman further revealed that \$2,000.00 would curb Main Street on the south side from Cuyler to Fayette as well as the north side.

Granite Curb:

Trustee Alderman had investigated the possibility of granite curb which would entail a figure of \$3.16/lineal foot which would be about double for the expenditure. Motion was made by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Green to advise Trustee Alderman to order the material for curbing on East Main Street.

Police Report:

The Police Report for the month of April indicated that total fines and bail forfeitures collected for Motor Vehicle and Criminal Offenses totaled \$170.00. Speeders were the top offenders with only one caught failing to heed a Stop Sign. May 16, 1971, a revised Stop Sign Ordinance will become effective with the installation of stop signs on many intersections previously unmarked.

Historic Palmyra:

Mrs. Lois Lynch asked permission to have a Book Sale on May 22, 1971 on the Main Street during Sidewalk Sale Days. Board approved this request.

Unpaid Wat. & Sew., Mis. Bills:

Motion was made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair that the unpaid water and sewer bills as well as any other bills owing the Village of Palmyra as of April 30, 1971 be added to the Village Taxes to be levied as of June 1, 1971.

J. O'Brien:

A letter of appreciation was read to the board from former Fire Chief James C. O'Brien for the testimonial dinner and gift at the Garlock House on April 12, 1971.

Canal Days:

A letter from Paul T. Rubery asked permission of the Village Board for the use of the Park and Club Rooms and the Village Park for the annual Canal Days to be scheduled for September 18, 19, 1971. Motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried to grant this request.

Plan.Brd. A.McKeown Res. as Chair.

A letter received from Arthur McKeown advised that he wished to be relieved of his duties as Chairman of the Planning Board as of July 1, 1971, but would continue to work with the board.

Cert. of Work. Program:

A letter of Certification indicated that the Palmyra Urban Renewal Program Workable Program had been recertified. (Letter received from W. Roche, Agency Director.) Program has now been certified until 5/1/73.

Hsg.Auth.:

A letter was received from Urban Renewal Director William Roche urging the adoption of a Housing Authority. Motion was made by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Green and vetoed by Trustee Alderman and Mayor Nussbaumer as follows:

RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra shall adopt a Housing Authority. Motion is to be tabled.

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING STOP INTERSECTIONS

Section 1. DEFINITIONS

Section 3. REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES

Trustee Leysath commented that funds were available in the Capital Reserve Building Fund and while there were no major changes in the present rooms on the main floor, the hallway to include the stairway area would be enclosed, new rest room facilities would be provided and the entrances would be remodeled. It was their thought that this money could be put to better use by way of investing in a new building project rather than using the funds to renovate the old building.

Wat. Dept. Trainee Apps.: Village Board and Hiram VanEtten, Operator of the Water & Sewer Plants, interviewed David Schulters of Vienna Street and Delbert Freyn, Canal Street, for a trainee position at the Water and Sewer Plants. Board members, after talking with the men advised Mr. VanEtten to make the decision as to who should be hired. D. Freyn had not visited the plants as had the Schulters lad. Mr. VanEtten advised that he would show Mr. Freyn through the plants prior to making a decision.

Weykman Bldg.: A discussion of obtaining or writing specs for the demolition of this building located at 305 East Main Street prompted Trustee L. Green to comment that he would delve into the matter.

Stakes Wat. Line: Motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried to ask Operator VanEtten to purchase stakes and signs which would indicate the water line between Canandaigua Lake and the Village of Palmyra.

Fayette St. One-Way: Attorney Nesbitt had drawn the necessary papers for review by the board and asked that a date be set for a public hearing for the proposed Fayette Street One-Way North, as well as to rescind the Stop Sign on Fayette Street abutting East Foster Street. Date set for these hearings to be June 7, 1971 at 7:30 P.M.

Comm. Ctr.: Motion was made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Leysath to allow Mayor Nussbaumer to sign the contract between the Town of Palmyra, Community Center and the Village of Palmyra, with the Village of Palmyra to be disbursing agent for the payroll for the Comm. Ctr.

moded Equip:

Board members gave Trustee Alderman permission to dispose of or sell, if possible, any outmoded equipment in the Village Barns not used by the highway department.

Hsg.Auth.:

Mr. John Kenny of the Village of Newark, Housing Authority Director, spoke with the Village Board relative to the possible establishment of a housing authority in conjunction with the Urban Renewal Authority. He advised that the Housing Authority is a public body constructed by the New York State Legislature. In order to establish a housing authority, the village must pass a local resolution. The Housing Authority would have special powers such as to borrow money under certain circumstances by sanction of the village board. Money must be borrowed for a specific purpose, to build houses or housing, only. The housing authority would be established for a period of 5 years. There would be 5 members on the board with the director appointed for a five year period, with a member to serve one year, one for two years, one for three years and one for four years. As each term would expire, a new man would be placed on the board for a five year period, thus insuring continuity of plans projected by the previous members.

In regard to a site for the housing, the village board must approve of the site and must then provide sewers and water. Mr. Kenny commented that the village board must also approve of the developer. He cautioned that the Urban Development Corporation has been known to override some zoning laws of a municipality and for this reason would wish to alert the board for this pitfall. A legal housing authority allows for low income housing (income vs number of children in family.) The housing is usually subsidized for 40 years with the government paying 50% and the tenant 50%. The land in this particular housing area is usually estimated to be worth about \$1.50/sq. ft. 51%, according to Mr. Kenny, must be devoted to housing, with the Senior Citizen being classified in the low income group.

AMENDMENT TO DUMP RULES & REGULATIONS

6/1/71

WHEREAS, the Village of Palmyra is the owner of certain lands situated on the Garnsey Road in the Town of Palmyra which have been used for a sanitary land fill or dumping operation, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire by the Board of Trustees to operate said sanitary land fill in such a manner as to be a benefit to the health and welfare of the people of the Village of Palmyra and the Town of Palmyra, and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish the foregoing the Board of Trustees is of the opinion that proper rules and regulations be adopted and promulgated,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, having a proprietary interest in said sanitary land fill or dump located on the Garnsey Road in the Town of Palmyra, the Board of Trustees does hereby adopt and promulgate the following rules and regulations in relation to the use of and operation of the said sanitary land fill or dump:

Section 1 Definitions

As used in these Rules and Regulations, "Persons" shall mean an individual, association, partnership, or corporation.

"Refuse" shall mean and include garbage, trash, rubbish, and similar used or waste materials.

"Dispose" shall mean to dump, deposit, throw, throw away by person or by another with the consent or approval, active or passive, of a person in a position to control or prevent the same.

"Public Sanitary Land Fill" shall mean the lands owned by the Village of Palmyra used for disposal purposes and located on the Garnsey Road in the Town of Palmyra.

"Attendant" shall be a person employed either by the Town or Village of Palmyra as its agent to care for the Public Sanitary Land Fill.

"Commercial Hauler" shall mean a person who regularly hauls for hire on the basis of an independent contractual relationship.

Section 2. Persons Entitled to the Use of the Public Sanitary Land Fill Shall be and is Hereby Amended to Read as Follows as of June 1, 1971

No person other than those who are residents of the Town of Palmyra and Village of Palmyra displaying a permit or "sticker" on the windshield of the transporting vehicle shall dispose of refuse on said sanitary Land Fill. Any person, other than a commercial hauler, who is a resident of the Town of Palmyra or Village of Palmyra, or business association or corporation with its main office and principal place of business located in the Town or Village of Palmyra, may, upon application, obtain a permit or "sticker" from the Clerk of the Village of Palmyra. Town of Palmyra residents shall pay a fee of fifty cents (\$.50) for a permit or sticker which shall be valid permission to dispose on said Sanitary Land Fill from June 1, 1971 until and including December 31, 1971 at which time application must be again made for a "current sticker" for dumping and similar application may be made to the Clerk of the Village of Palmyra by payment of a fee to be determined.

Village of Palmyra residents shall pay a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) for a permit or sticker which shall be valid permission to dispose on said Sanitary Land Fill from June 1, 1971 until and including May 31, 1972 at which time application must be made again for a "current sticker" for dumping and similar application may be made to the Clerk of the Village of Palmyra by payment of a fee to be determined.

Commercial Haulers may, upon application, and payment of Eight Dollars and Sixty Cents (\$8.60) a Cubic Yard per truck capacity per month payable monthly, obtain a permit or "sticker" from the Clerk of the Village of Palmyra. The permit or "sticker" shall be valid permission to dispose on said Sanitary Land Fill from June 1, 1971 until and including May 31, 1971 providing the monthly fee has been made each month. Said commercial haulers may, upon application, obtain permits or stickers for dumping in each subsequent year upon similar application to the Clerk of the Village of Palmyra and payment of the aforesaid fee. Subsequently issued permits or "stickers" shall be valid only during the period June 1st to and including May 31st of each year for which issued. Prior to obtaining said permit, the commercial hauler must file with the Clerk a list of his customers as of the date of filing.

Section 3. Prohibited Refuse

No person shall dispose of any of the following refuse:

- (a) Refuse other than that having its origination point within the Town or Village of Palmyra.
- (b) Rubber, plastics, or solvents.
- (c) Poisonous acids, infected materials, dead animals, or parts thereof, or explosives.
- (d) Stumps, tree trunks, tree limbs, and brush except at the direction of the Attendant.
- (e) Paper or paper products unless bound and tied in a manner suitable to prevent dispersal by wind and elements.

Section 4. Disposal Area

No person shall dispose of refuse on the Sanitary

Land Fill except by entering the gates through the fence. No person shall dispose of refuse by throwing over the fence on the Sanitary Land Fill Site.

Disposal shall be made only in the designated area and, when an attendant is on duty, only at the direction of the attendant.

Section 5. Disposal Hours

No person other than commercial haulers duly licensed by the Village of Palmyra shall dispose of refuse on the Sanitary Land Fill except between the hours 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on Saturdays and 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on Wednesdays, of each week.

Commercial haulers will be prohibited from dumping on Saturdays.

Any commercial hauler permitted to dispose on said Sanitary Land Fill shall be given a key at said land fill, and said commercial hauler may enter said premises at any time up to 4:00 P.M. daily except on Saturdays and Sundays for the purpose of disposal. Said commercial hauler so entering shall be charged with the obligation of closing and locking said gate, and will not permit any one other than the commercial hauler to enter while said hauler is engaged in disposal.

Section 6. Revocation of permit

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra may revoke the permit of any person violating any of the rules and regulations set forth hereinabove, and, commence a proceeding under the applicable statutes against any person disposing on said premises without a permit.

The above amendment shall become effective immediately.

WHEREAS: It has been the procedure for the Village of Palmyra to be reimbursed by the Community Center for any expenses over and above the amount contributed, and,

WHEREAS: The Treasurer of the Village of Palmyra has ascertained that the amount due the Village of Palmyra from the Community Center as of 5/31/71 shall be \$4,902.06,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Community Center shall contribute as its share the amount of \$4,402.06, a difference of \$500.00, because of the staggering of the fiscal years of the Town of Palmyra and the Village of Palmyra, which in all aspects would indicate that the Town of Palmyra had contributed \$6,000.00 rather than \$5,500.00 from December 1, 1970 through May 31, 1971, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: It was the consensus of the board that it was acting in all good faith for the good of the community, to comply with the request of the Community Center, Inc.

W. Strong: Warner Strong, West Jackson Street, asked the Village Board what the legal speed limit was in the Village in that he commented, there seem to be any number of racing cars on his street. The board informed him that it is expected in the near future that a new radar equipment will be in operation to apprehend these speeders.

Fire Exting.: Motion was made by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Green, that fire extinguishers be purchased for use in the Community Center area on the request of the Palmyra Fire Department. Motion carried.

Executive Session: Motion was made by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Alderman that the Village Board move into Executive Session at 9:45 P.M. Motion carried.

Re-Convene: On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair, and carried, the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of May 24, 1971, was re-convened at 10:05 P.M.

Storm Sew. Permit: An application for a storm sewer along with a check for \$75.00 was received from the 1st Baptist Church to attach to the village storm sewer on Canandaigua Street. Application was approved on motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Leysath, and carried.

Renovat. Vil. Hall: Motion was made by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Leysath and carried to approve the bid of Roche-Kimberly Construction Co. for the renovation of the Village Hall in the amount of \$24,453.00.

Cleaner for Fire Trks.: The Fire Department had asked permission to purchase 18 gals. of a special cleaner to be mixed with water for cleaning the fire equipment, trucks, etc. at a cost of \$3.89/gal. (Minimum order to be not less than \$50.00). Motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Alderman and carried to approve this purchase. (Texas Refinery, Fort Worth, Texas.)

Dump to Close, Mem. Day: Motion was made by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair, and carried to instruct the clerk to write letters to the commercial haulers to ask their cooperation in refraining from using the dump on Memorial Day, May 31, 1971.

Dump Contracts: Trustee Leysath advised the board that the dump contracts will be finalized with the commercial haulers with a few changes; namely, the village dump will not be open to commercial haulers on Saturdays and the fee for commercial haulers will be \$8.60 a Cubic Yard per truck capacity per month payable monthly. Motion was made by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried to approve of the amendment to the Dump Rules and Regulations to be in effect as of 6/1/71.

The mayor was asked to compose a letter to be sent to Senator T. Day, Assemblyman J. Finley and Chairman Colvin of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors, urging their support of the consolidation of the Police Department.
- Market St. Mini-Park:** Trustee Sinclair asked permission of the Village Board to allow village trucks to carry fill and top soil to the former Mae Vanderwege property on Market Street. The Jaycees had previously done some work cleaning up the area and hope to make a mini-park on the spot.
- Health Officer:** Motion was made by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Leysath, and carried to appoint Dr. Samuel Adams, Cornwall Road, Palmyra, New York, Health Officer for the Village of Palmyra for the next 4 years. Motion carried.
- Memorial Day Parade:** A letter received from the American Legion invited all board members to ride in the Memorial Day parade which would assemble at 9:00 A.M. on May 31st. Clerk was instructed to advise Commander Eddy that all board members would plan to be present.
