#### Landfill:

Trustee Green commented that he had not heard from Supervisor Aplin relative to the landfill and as a result had composed a memo which he would read relative to the closing of the land-fill to the Town of Palmyra residents as of 6/1/74. On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Strong and carried,

the following memo was adopted:

"The Village of Palmyra has owned and operated the landfill on Garnsey Road since it was opened in 1954.

Since 1954 the New York State laws governing landfills has changed considerably. Years ago the cost of operation of a landfill was minimal because it was not necessary to cover and compact the trash. Because of the stringent laws, we must now follow, the costs of operating and maintaining a landfill have skyrocketed to unreasonable amounts.

In the village fiscal year June 1973 through June 1974, I estimate that the cost of operating the landfill is \$25,000.-\$30,000. This money comes from the following sources. \$6,000. from the village taxpayers, \$6,000. from the town taxpayers, (of which the village taxpayers are part) and the balance of \$13,000 - \$17,000. comes from the commercial haulers and the

ticket sales.

For many years the village board has felt that the operation of the landfill should be a town board function. We feel that as long as the village is part of the town then the town should assume the responsibility that is rightfully theirs.

should assume the responsibility that is rightfully theirs. For some reason unknown to the village board, the town is reluctant to act. Because of the town board's reluctance to act in any direction, then the Village Board must act in the best interest for the village taxpayers.

Effective June 1, 1974, the landfill will be closed to the people living in the Town of Palmyra, outside the Village. The landfill operator will be instructed to accept trash from persons living only in the village or from a commercial hauler who has picked up trash from the village only. For the taxpayer in the village, there will be no monies paid to operate a landfill that comes from taxes levied by assessment. The landfill will be funded on a "pay as you use it" basis. More public information will be available on this phase of operating in the very near future.

Urban Rerewal: Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer informed the board that she had had a request from Paul Rubery, Esq., relative to a revised resolution regarding the borrowing of \$190,000.00 for the urban renewal project for the installation of curbs, water and storm sewer lines, sidewalks and parking in the Urban Renewal Area (Market, William and Canal Streets) The resolution was sent to Rubery who in turn forwarded on to the bank and nothing further has been heard. (Loan is to be paid in 3 yrs.)

Jail:

Due to the series of events, it is deemed advisable to place a wire mesh screen of some sort over the open portholes of the jail door leading into the area of the jail cells. In addition an electrical switch should be placed in the Police Office to turn the lights on and off in the jail. Trustee Strong commented that he felt it would be advantageous to get quotations for placing an electrical bolt on the door.

Potter Sign: The Laundromat Sign on William Street, property of Laurence Potter was discussed by the board. Board felt that he should be notified that he was in violation for replacing the broken sign. Clerk instructed to so inform Zoning Officer Bruce Wideman to send the proper papers.

Suggest Re-Zoning E. Main, Holmes & Canal St.: Mayor Fitzgerald commented that the Zoning Board of Appeals had denied the application from Walter Drury for a variance to allow a home occupation at 501 East Main Street, in an R-2 Zone. Discussion by the board indicated that the Planning Board should be informed to consider re-zoning this "flat-iron" or pieshaped area to commercial.

Jack L. Freyn, Canandaigua Road, c/o Mrs. F. Caffyn; and Robert I. Nichols, Bldg. A176, Salzburg Village.

Ford Truck: Clerk informed the board that U. W. Sherburne, Inc. informed the village by letter that the truck that had been bid in October, 1973 to be delivered this spring by Sherburne, was in the backlog of orders of Ford Motors and would not be delivered until the spring of 1975. Clerk asked to have Ray Smith, Highway Foreman, to check into the matter further.

Recognize New Citizens: Mayor Fitzgerald commented that he felt it would be apropos to arrange some type of ceremony for any new citizens that might be in the village. Trustee Wilson was asked to handle such a matter.

Re-invest Funds: The following motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried:
