BE IF RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, Wayne County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The reconstruction of the heating and ventilation system of the Village Hall of the Village of Palmyra, New York, is hereby authorized at a total estimated cost of not exceeding \$14,000.

Section 2. The plan of financing the aforesaid object or purpose is as follows:

- (a) By the use of \$7,500 current funds available in the budget of the Village of Palmyra, New York, and which is hereby appropriated for such purpose; and
- (b) By the issuance of not exceeding \$6,500 serial bonds of the Village of Palmyra, New York,

hereby authorized, which shall mature in the manner provided by law over a period not exceeding five years, computed from the date of said bonds or the date of the first bond anticipation note issued in anticipation thereof, whichever is the earlier.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of such object or purpose is ten years, pursuant to subdivision 13 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, provided, however, that said bonds shall mature over a period not in excess of five years, as hereinabove set forth.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the aforesaid current funds will be made available prior to the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 5. The faith and credit of the Village of Palmyra, New York, are hereby irrevocably phedged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of andinterest on such bonds as the same become due and payable. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable property of said Village a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Saction 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Village Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such menner as may be prescribed by said Village Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
