<u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> Mayor Elliott called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

SWEARING IN: The swearing in of the new Village Trustees, Ann F. Guest and Harold E. Kruger, and Village Justice Carol A. Salomon, followed by a brief reception.

MEETING RESUMED: Mayor Elliott resumed the meeting at 7:18 p.m. with a moment of silence for Mr. Larry Snyder past Palmyra Businessman and previous owner of Elmer's Service.

<u>CHANGE IN AGENDA:</u> Mayor Elliott moved to add the Crop Walk and Joint Fuel Facility to the agenda, seconded by Trustee Kruger, vote, 4 ayes, <u>CARRIED</u>.

CITIZEN P. RETAN ON LIGHTS ON NEIGHBORS' GARAGE: P. Retan complained about his neighbor's bright dusk to dawn light on his new garage. He stated that the light was so bright he could read the newspaper at night without the lights on. The Village has no law against this type of problem, stated P. Retan. Mayor Elliott noted that this should be something looked at after the master plan.

P. Retan also noted that Morelocks had been doing work at 123 Vienna and did not have a permit for work. Mayor Elliott thought that E. Dundas, Code Enforcement Officer should go see about the construction.

Roy McMaster representative of Donegan, Assoc. reviewed the 1994-95 Village of Palmyra Budget. Mr. McMaster used visual aids to explained expenditures and revenues. Upon completion of the explanation, E. Hartnagel asked where the savings was now that the VOP is using MHPC for the W/WW. R. McMaster responded that the sum of \$150,000 had been transfered to the reserve and that even after that transfer approx. \$47,000 savings was noted.

R. McMaster noted that the amount of expenditure in $\mbox{W/WW}$ should drop even more next year.

Mayor Elliott explained the local law #4, 1993, and why it was not valid and needed to be done over as LL#1, 1994. The reason given was the lack of bounderies on LL#4, 1993. Mayor Elliott noted that there was a map attached to LL#1, 1994, with a written description of the boundaries.

Trustee Kruger asked about the existing apts. on first floors and what would happen to them. Mayor Elliott noted that no one had applied for a building permit, and a permit is required.

Mayor Elliott noted that many people do not shop downtown but in the malls. If the downtown is lost it will not be able to be brought back.

Trustee Kruger asked if there was money available and couldn't the small stores get the money as well as big stores, and Mayor Elliott responded that there was. Trustee Kruger inquired about how to get the information and who to ask. Mayor Elliott said Barb Harper can help since she is doing work with banks at this time. Mayor Elliott explained the Business group that he and Supervisor Lyons tried to get started and that there was a lack of interest. J. Merrick asked what is going to be done with the downtown, saying the average life of a business in the Village is 6-8 months. B. Joslin noted that many of the bldg. owners are refusing to make repairs on the bldgs. adding to the deterioration of downtown.

Trustee Wooden noted that he did not think that apts. on the first floor was going to help. Merrick noted that he would pay his mortgage and taxes no matter what he had to do. Trustee Wooden said that the poor business is not necessarily the responsibility of the VOP. J. Merrick noted that his bldgs. cannot be sold for what he paid for them.

B. Joslin asked if the VOP had planned to get another officer so that a foot patrol would be possible, as discussed last year. D. Wirth stated something had to be done with downtown parking and that the 2 hr. rule needed to be inforced. Trustee Kruger asked Chief Dalton to make an outline of the parking problems.

Mayor Elliott closed the public hearing at 8:50 p.m.

ROBERT RIDER: R. Rider welcomed the new VB MEMBERS and advised the VB of his intentions to split the parcel of land he has on Park Dr. and Throop St. He stated that by splitting the tenants (Winross) would be interested in buying or staying and fixing up the land. It would look much better. R. Rider stated that he would be seeing the Planning Board on Wednesday night. He also said that he could not find a negative impact on the VOP.

Trustee Wooden asked if Rider would need a variance because of the set backs on the side lot. E. Hartnagel noted that the more violations on each property should it be split.

WAYNE COUNTY TAKING OVER VOP ELECTIONS: M. Jankowski, Republican Party Chairperson and Joan Wiedrick, Democrat Party Chairperson, read letter stating their concerns about local elections being run in the VOP vs being run by the Cty. We would be the last to go with the Cty. on this said J. Wiedrick. The Cty would do the election professionally because that is what they do and it is their job. Mayor Elliott noted that having the CTY do the

election would cost \$300 - \$400 more for strips and absentee ballots, everything else would be done as it is done now by the

Clerk. We would save nothing and the Clerk is handling the election just as well. Trustee Kruger noted that this would give the Clerk less to do since she already has many responsibilities. Mayor Elliott noted his concern about the different rules in the elections from one level to another. Mayor Elliott noted that all rules should be the same such as caucus, election, etc.

The VB decided to invite the Wyn. Cty. BD. of Elec. to the May 16th meeting as well as the Chairperson of both parties at 7:30 p·m.

ABSTRACT #21: Mayor Elliott moved to authorize the Treasurer to pay the vouchers #1092 through 1136 totalling \$35,458.94, seconded by Trustee Wooden, vote, 4 ayes, CARRIED.

UTILITY BILL RESOLUTION: Mayor Elliott resolved to authorize the Treasurer to pay utility bills between VB meetings, should they become due, seconded by Trustee Wooden, vote, 4 ayes, CARRIED.

JOINT FUEL FACILITY AND CONTRACT: Trustee Kruger resolved that Mayor Elliott be authorized to sign the Joint Fuel Facility Contract, seconded by Trustee Wooden, vote, 4 ayes, <u>CARRIED</u>.

Mayor Elliott noted that the billing would be done the first time in advance so that the school would not have to pay out in advance, and subsequent payments would be done monthly when the bills become due. The VOP vehicles would each have a ring in their gas tanks which would register each time the vehicle got fuel and compute the amount.

Trustee Kruger asked if the School would go out for bids and Mayor Elliott replied each year. Attorney Nesbitt noted that the VOP was considered a small part of this joint venture and that the VOP would not be considered liable, the VOP cannot get charged anymore than the School. Also four cents is included to cover insurance for spills.

CROP WALK: Mayor Elliott moved to allow the Crop Walk to use the VOP sidewalks and VOP park on May 1, 1994, at 12:00 p.m. seconded by Trustee Kruger, vote, 4 ayes, CARRIED.
