Mr. Bonner, Zoning expert from Churchville, N. Y. visited the Board and outlined the necessary ground work relative to the adoption of a zoning ordinance.

Mr. Spencer L. Knapp appeared before the Board and advised that while putting in a new concrete floor in his garage he had an opportunity to get ready-mix cement to lay a new side walk in front of his property. He stated that he did not have time to contact the Village Board before proceeding with the work as the men and ready-mix concrete were there ready to start the job at once. He also stated that he was advising the Board at this time so that he might receive refund for the portion of the cost that the Village would allow. He was advised that the Village would pay  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost figured at \$.55 per square foot.

The Clerk was directed to write to the James R. Hickey Post, thanking them for the flag and standard presented to the Village for use in the Justice rooms.

Mr. Meloy Smith and Mr. Larson, Village Engineers visited the Board to give them a detailed report of their study and suggestions to date relative to additional water filter facilities and water storage. Further study in this matter will be made and it is hoped that the Board and at least one of the engineers will be able to visit a plant that is now under operation so that they may discuss the matter further before a decision is arrived at.

Mr. Henry W. Griffith visited the Board and entered into the discussion concerning the water filter, water storage plant and also discussed the replacement of water mains in certain parts of the Village where he felt they were most needed.

Mr. Bowens of the Davey Tree Experts visited the Board and advised that he had made a thorough inspection of the trees in our Village and made recommendations as to the trees that needed to be removed and also trees that he felt were not hazardous but would need some repair. He was advised by the Board to proceed with the removal of trees as soon as Mr. Hanagan, highway working foreman, would be able to spare a truck and two or three men to help cart away the wood as the trees were cut. Mr Bowen was advised not to exceed \$1200.00 in removable, repair and cutting out of dead wood until he had reported to the Board.

The Clerk was directed to write to the President of each of the Fire companies and advise them to instruct all truck drivers that when answering a fire alarm they were not leave the truck room until they found out whether or not the fire was outside the County line and if fire was outside County line, they were to call the proper authorities at Lyons, N.Y. and advise them they were answering a Mutual Aid Call which would take them outside the County Line. This procedure is necessary to comply with the Rules and Regulations of Wayne Co., self Assureds compensation coverage.

The Clerk was directed to advertise for bids on a motorcycle now owned by the Village.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Jeffery, seconded by Mr. Fisk, same were approved.

The Clerk was directed to write to the Superintendent of the Water Department at Tupper Lake, N. Y. and try to arrange a suitable time for the members of the Village Board, Mr. William German and Mr. Meloy Smith or Mr. W.C. Larsen, engineers to visit the diatomaceous filter plant now in operation at Tupper Lake, N.Y., to get an idea how a multi-unit plant operates and the problems they encounter.

The Clerk was directed to write to the Williams<sup>son</sup> Law Book Co., and get further information as to prices on the uniform traffic tickets, number of sets of tickets per pad and any further information available.

Mr. Jeffery advised the Board that he had been approached by Mr. Veryl Pembroke, Manager of the Wayne Coal and Lumber Co., relative to the purchase of the old Canal bed, directly in the rear of their Canal Street plant. Mr. Jeffery was instructed to advise that the Village Board would have the land surveyed at the expense of the Wayne Coal and Lumber Company and sell the land to them at the price paid by the Village. The Board awaits the wishes of the Wayne Coal and Lumber Company in the matter.

The Clerk was instructed to reply to a letter received from Gaess Outdoor Advertising., Inc. 639 Broadway, Westwood, N. J., and furnish the information desired relative to erecting a Neon sign on the roof of the building known as Neale's Super Station.

The Village Board having rejected the bid made by Mr. John Blazey on the Village owned motorcycle, the Clerk was directed to return bid and check in amount of \$7.50.

The Clerk was instructed to continue a notice in the Palmyra Courier Journal for the next two weeks so that interested parties would have until July 27th., to present bids.

The following men were appointed as members of a Village Planning Committee, whose duties consist of making a study of rules and regulations relative to construction and to meet with a Town Committee and an expert on zoning laws and make recommendations to the Village Board, and relative to the necessity of appointing a Permanent Planning Board. Such procedure would naturally have to be voted on by the voters of this Village and approved before permanent action could be taken. Members, George Dykema, Milton Vanden Bout, William Deys, Eugene McGuire, Freeman Spanganberg and Luther Sheldon, advised by letter. The Clerk was instructed to have the resolution which was adopted September 14th., 1948 relative to the furnishing of water to residents or property owners residing outside the Village, unless they are within a legally organized water district, published in the Palmyra Courier Journal the week of July 22, and July 29th., 1954.

A notice relative to registration of Multiple dwellings published in the Palmyra Courier Journal, July 15th issue advising all owners of multiple dwelling in the Village of Palmyra that they are required to file a statement with Wallace J. Beatty, Village Clerk, during the month of July.

The Clerk was instructed to file the following claim.  
In the Matter of the Claim of Russell Chapman, as guardian ad litem of Francis F. Chapman against Village of Palmyra, N.Y. and James D. Baxter.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read, and on motion by Mr. Jeffery, seconded by Mr. Fisk, same were approved.

## WATER SERVICE RESTRICTIONS OUTSIDE OF VILLAGE

Several years ago, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra adopted a resolution providing that in the future municipal water service would not be furnished outside of the village ~~(except to persons who had been~~ ~~in a legally organized water district)~~, and that no further connections would be made to any privately owned pipe or main outside of the village, and that no person receiving service should permit any other resident or property owner to take water from his or her service pipe. Residents and property owners in a legally organized water district were excepted from these restrictions.

It was also provided that persons then obtaining water from the village system and living outside of the village should have a reasonable time to either organize a district or obtain a supply of water elsewhere, and after a reasonable time service would be discontinued to persons who failed to comply.

Notice of the above general rules was given at the time, but unfortunately some persons have ignored or failed to heed these rules, and have constructed homes and in some instances bought trailers, and after being refused water service have been very disappointed. Others have made no effort to either form a water district or provide for water service of their own.

The Board of Trustees does not intend to cease to provide water service for a reasonable time to residents who were receiving water from the village system when the foregoing policy was established, but the Board is of the opinion these people have had a reasonable time within which to comply, and only part of the people receiving such service have complied.

Service furnished to people who are not in an organized water district have no assurance of service, which for the <sup>most</sup> part is through small pipes or makeshift arrangements, and neither the village or town are in any way responsible for the maintenance of such pipes or mains,

nor is anyone responsible, which makes a most unsatisfactory situation. When leaks or breaks develop the water is wasted and the village collects no revenue, and the village will neither repair such lines nor continue to furnish water in the future once such a condition is brought to its attention.

Residents obtain a somewhat cheaper rate in organized water districts and there is an organization responsible for the maintenance and servicing of the water mains in the public highway. Many persons who desire to build homes outside of the village are unwilling to invest their money with no assurance of water.

The Board of Trustees desire everyone concerned to realize that the policies established some years ago by prior village boards are still in effect and will be enforced.

Mr. James O'Brien, John Mouton, Mr. Everitt, 1st, 2nd and third Assistant fire chiefs and Mr. William Boys appeared before the Board to discuss the cause of the recent damage to the primer pump on our Maxim Fire truck. The Board was advised that the mechanic employed from the Young Fire Equipment Co. of Buffalo, N. Y. stated that the damage was caused by drivers or operators who tried to operate the pump with too much speed or in other words slam-bang treatment that the pump is not built to take. It was decided by the Board that members of the Department, who were efficient in handling said equipment should thoroughly school each operator before they be allowed to operate the equipment on their own. Present existing conditions relative to a large number of our Volunteer Firemen who are receiving the benefits of the department, tax exemptions and ect make absolutely no effort to attend a fire or take any active part in the welfare of the department. It was suggested by the Board that this matter be taken up with the Fire Chief, his Assistants and the Officers of the three Fire Companies and that steps be taken to eliminate such men who have no interest in the Department other than what benefits they may receive from same.

An application for a permit to connect a surface drain from the premises designated as 154 Gates Street and owned by Mrs. Ila Moore was approved and a permit signed by the Village President was ailed to Mrs. Moore.

The report received from Mrs. Gladys Brokaw showing Village taxes collected to date in amount of \$83,159.74 with uncollected taxes in amount of \$3,395.57 was ordered filed.

Mr. Fisk moved that the period for collecting taxes be extended to November 1st., 1954 and the Tax Collector so advised, seconded by Mr. Jeffery and on motion carried.

Mr. Fisk moved that the Village Adding Machine be left in the Trustees's room, Village Hall, Palmyra, N. Y. and the Clerk so advised Village employees, seconded by Mr. Jeffery and on motion carried.

The Clerk was directed to advise Mr. German that the Board approved the purchase of 24 water meters and also 540 feet of 3/4" copper tubing.

The Clerk was directed to advise Mr. Brown that they approved his recommendation relative to keeping Mr. Jacob Bremus as a regular employee on the Cemetery payroll and laying off Mr. John Rolland after due notice is given.

Mr. Jeffery moved that the Police be authorized to purchase necessary finger print equipment but they are not to duplicate any equipment they now have. Before order for this equipment is placed they are to contact Mr. George W. Contant and have the order O.Ked., seconded by Mr. Fisk and on motion carried.

The Clerk was directed to insert a notice in the Palmyra Courier advising property owners that bills presented to the Village for part payment of new sidewalk would not be honored unless application had first been made to the Village Board and same had been approved.

The clerk was authorized to order two new tires for rear wheels of Police car and to have puncture proof tubes put in all four tires.

The Clerk was directed to advise Mr. Meloy Smith that the Board had made arrangements to visit Tupper Lake water Department to inspect filter plant and were leaving Palmyra at 1:P.M. Saturday, August 7th., and would return to Palmyra Sunday afternoon or evening August 8th., and also to advise that if it is possible for Mr. Smith or Mr. Larson to make the trip with them that they kindly advise by phone or letter and plan to be in Palmyra by 1: P.M. August 7th., as Board members will be leaving at that time.
