Nesbitt spke. of Newark's "hard-and-fast"

rule...will not entertain special districts....
Trustee Gilmore asked how high an amt. cld. they be charged...maybe VOP needs to re-coup in that manner.

Atty. Nesbitt asked if VOP had contracts wth. residents there - individual or otherwise...Mayor sd. for water, contract wth. Town of Macedon - for sewer no agreement wth. four (4) who have; technically illegal, per Atty. Nesbitt...must be a written contract...if they don't pay, no way to collect...can't put lien on/add to VOP taxes as they are not in VOP....private obligation. Atty. Nesbitt sd. any out-of-district user, law requires contract.

Trustee Wooden asked about annexation for builders' (Nolan/Brooks) land itself...wld. need just need permission frm. builders & Town of Macedon...Atty. Nesbitt sd. that some villages 'straddle' towns... four or five lots involved. ...VOP cld. be rec. taxes on sme., per Trustee Wooden...part of VOP cld. be in Town of Macedon, per Atty. Nesbitt. Mr. Wooden asked why not the VOP pursue remainder of Burnham Hts. for annexation...they receive VOP benefits... snowplowing, etc. It was pointed out that the foregoing builders given permission - wld. entertain a motion to form a district. Lot of work to form a district, per Atty. Nesbitt - not worthwhile for so small an area. Mayor referred to Bd. mtg. of 2/21/89 and read frm. Minutes of same when builders approached the Bd. Wld. not affect builders - Mayor sd. he wld. speak wth. builders...he referred to newspaper article in which discussed by Town of Macedon.

Bl.Crss./ Bl.Shld.:

Mayor Elliott referred to communication frm. Supervisor C. Darron re Blue Cross/Blue Shield & his draft letter....Vill. Treas. has schedules...perhaps VOP cld. save money, therefore, beneficial to explore.

P.D.:

Bd. discussion on Voucher for \$63. frm. former Police Officer T. Murdock for appearing before Grand Jury - incident occurred while he was VOP employee. Atty. Nesbitt sd. policy shld. be established by Bd. Bd. agreed to honor the Voucher and payment be mde. Further discussion on vacation time owed Police Officer R. Hall when he left the VOP - matter resolved by Bd.,i.e. Officer Hall, when leaving the VOP, was 'owed' two (2) weeks vacation; Bd. agreed they would carry over sd. vacation until next fiscal yr.

Moment of Silence:

Mayor Elliott requested a moment of silence prior to conducting the business of the Board.

Tenta.Budg. Hrng.:

Mayor Elliott opened the public hearing @ 7:10 p.m. - introduced the VB, Vill. Atty. & Mr. Roy McMasters, representing Bernard P. Donegan Assoc. - consultants for the VOP; the Clerk introduced the new Courier-Journal rep., Mr. Burt Olton.

Mayor Elliott requested the Clerk to read the Legal Notice re the public hearing on the VOP's tentative budget for 1989-90, following which Mr. McMasters began an "over-view" of the proposed budget.

He referred to Page 4 which showed the overall budget - Appropriations, how much money will be spent; VOP wld. spend approx. amt. of \$1,700,000. among General Fund, Water Fund & Sewer Fund, all of which are specified by the NYS Comptroller's Office.

General Fund - amt. to be expended, \$1,108,409. - from this subtract estimated revenues (other than Real Property Tax), \$369,532.; subtract Fund Balance, \$134,087. - remaining must be raised by the Real Property Tax, \$604,790. Mr. McMasters stated that the tentative budget may be amended by the VB prior to final adoption. He elaborated upon translation into tax rate...distribute to Real Property Assessed Valuation, \$41,170,000. as Tax Roll presently stands....portion of Roll (Real Property Franchises) provided by State Dept. of Equalization & Assessment - estimated @ \$14.69 per thousand - do not anticipate this to vary much; to compare wth. other villages, refer to full value tax rate based on equalization rate of 73%...full value of VOP over \$56,105,205. - approx. \$10.78 tax rate.

Proposed schedule, adoption on 4/17/89; must be in place by 5/1/89. Mr. McMasters referred to Pg. 5, History & Evaluation of Tax Levy & Rate. Mr. Jack Lynn spoke of reassessments and ups-and-downs. The Mayor told Mr. Lynn that the VOP adopts the Town Tax Roll - VOP to have own prepared wld. cost large sum of money ea. yr. He spke. of small stipend pd. to Town Assessor ea. yr. (approx. \$2400.) much less than having Tax Roll prepared. Has not changed very much since the re-evaluation - has become stable although property values have increased....

Mr. McMasters referred to pie-chart re General Fund Expenses on Pg. 14 and explained the various categories; then reviewed was General Fund Expenses by 'Object Code' on Pg. 15. General Fund Revenues by 'Major Category," Pg. 16 was reviewed.

Briefly reviewed was Water Fund History & Evaluation on Pg. 38 - and the pie-chart, Water Fund Expenses by 'Major Category' (Pg. 39) and 'Object Code' (Pg. 40) - Water Fund Revenues by 'Major Category' (Pg. 44) and a like review of Sewer Fund History & Evaluation as well as Sewer Fund Expenses by 'Major Category' and 'Object Code' on Pgs. 51, 52 & 53, respectively, and Sewer Fund Revenues by 'Major Category', Pg. 58.



Public Questions & Comments:

Mrs. P. Schade Treas./Palmyra Library, spke. of her /their concern re Library's budget request of \$18,000. for 1989-90 and the VOP's placing amt. of \$13,000. in '89-'90 budget - down frm. prior yrs.(\$15,000.). She reviewed their prior requests and monies needed with. which to operate the Library. She asked specifics - "why were they cut"...she pleaded the Library's financial responsibilities and wld. the VB please reconsider.

The Mayor said no fault of Library — all requests placed in budget process by which they arrived at the tax figures making the tax rate very high — VB felt they cld. not impose such a large tax increase on its citizens....requests go up every year, he sd. VOP receiving less—and—less in State funding... CHIPS, O&M, Community Ctr., etc. — State cuts amt. to approx. \$54,000. This amt. must be mde. up by raising taxes or cutting figures frm. budget. State is proposing allowing VOP "Property Transfer Tax"... wld. be small dollar figure on homes sold (one—half of one percent)....taking away \$54,000./giving bk. approx. \$9,000. He cited example of VOP 'cuts' — in P.D., funded one less position....time to bring tax levy to a livable amt. — not create a tax burden to taxpayers....

Mrs. Schade asked what wld. occur if State did fund in some areas as in 'CHIPS'....cld. Library apply at later date for additional funding...Trustee Frontuto spke. of time-frame; problems wth. State budget - and VOP's deadline. Mrs. Schade also spke. of cut in funding frm. Town. Further discussion. Mrs. Frontuto spke. of VOP's support of Library and that 'services' wld. be provided... landscaping, etc. Mayor Elliott sd. that VOP 'eating' up some of its reserves. Mr. J. Lynn asked status of VOP's reserve funds...Trustee Pope sd. that budget takes quite a lot out of reserves... Mr. Lynn felt that VB shld. take out of reserves, give to Library and if and when \$\$\$\$'s come in, return to reserves...the Mayor explained that \$\$\$\$'s in reserves for specifics - no 'reserve' that covers Library, museums, ambulances, etc. come out of General Fund/tax money.

Mr. Lynn asked about P.D. position which was cut & wld. that not leave more \$\$\$\$!s for other necessities...Mayor sd. that "everything has gone up"...Mr. McMaster sd. that original request from P.D. was \$253,000./reduced to \$222,311., and enumerated the reductions...Mr. Lynn sd., no reflections intended, that the P.D. had been a very 'troublesome' department...he talked of getting new people, training them and their leaving...didn't see any change, he sd. Trustee Frontuto sd. VB sees change...able to re-hire a Patrolman (with VOP previously and left)...maybe more in future...beginning to stabilize, she sd. Mr. Lynn sd. P.D. Budget a big item - is it necessary for VOP to have a P.D. Mayor Elliott spke. of his prior yrs. on the Bd. when future of P.D. @ stake...public spke. 'loud and clear', he sd. in support of maintaining a P.D. Mr. Lynn sd. only 'noisemakers' attended the mtg. Still a big item, he sd., when one considers alternatives...number of villages and towns have no P.D. - ridiculous balance, he sd. when VOP can't help Library more.

Trustee Wooden said it wld. seem that VOP willing to keep derelicts off street, but not willing to spend money to keep from becoming derelicts...sd. he was in favor of VOP getting back up to last yr.'s level re Library. Trustee Gilmore spke. of his embarrassment re point(s) mde. by Mr. Lynn... feels that VB shld. reconsider. Mr. McMasters sd. only thing 'concrete' is dollar-size of tax levy...only once a year taxes can be raised... as long as equation works, budget can be amended...if VOP gets new revenues, cld. increase appropriation...cld. increase within the appropriation...Mrs. Schade asked about income during year and told by Mr. McMasters that additional revenues do come in during yr. that were not planned on...when realized, budget may be increased above what presented during hrng. Mrs. Schade asked permission to submit application re Library allotment - in your interest, per Mr. McMasters...Trustee Frontuto sd. cld. be done, although had not happened before.

Trustee Gilmore asked about a liasion person between VB and the Library - had been requested per Mrs. Schade and Trustee Gilmore sd. VB rec'd ltr. Mr. Lynn sd. that VB elected to make decisions based on knowledge of best interests of community. "noise makers frequently don't inform VB except for 'their noise"...have to take a little 'guff' if you feel something must be done. Mayor Elliott sd. that lot of thought/work went into every line item in budget.

Mrs. Schade asked about VOP CD's; the Mayor sd. they are in 'multiple' banks...put out for bid...Trustee Frontuto sd. whichever bank gives best interest..Mr. McMasters sd. that VOP obtains minimum of three (3) bids ea. mo. - two come due ea. mo...they "leapfrog" so that money available @ Bd. mtgs. to pay bills...all competitively bid...keeps Marine Midland honest in the rates...what they post for municipal investments...the VOP puts money wth. MM and anything over the initial \$200,000. of FDIC ins., they have to cover wth. pledging of collateral which means they hold notes or bonds of some other municipality or State of New York or Federal Treas. Bonds which they put up in case the bank wld. fail, then the Trust Dept. hands over that collateral to the VOP so it's covered and indemnified...then 'you' as private citizen wld. get only the first \$200,000. - after that 'you' have to take the 'hit' if the bank fails....municipal government is covered through the 'pledging' process...costs them money...therefore, the rate the VOP wld. receive wld. be less than what private citizen wld. rec. VOP...VOP able to take advantage when dealing wth. amts. over \$100,000. consolidating various 'pieces' - depends on time-frame...VOP has to pay bills....Mr. McMasters had further discussion wth. Mrs. Schade re VOP's CD's.

Mr. J. Lynn asked about years (comparisons)...Mr. McMasters sd. actual budget ninety-five (95) pages long...Mr. Lynn was referred to "History & Evaluation of Tax Levy & Rate".... Pg. 5 of budget (page given to Mr. Lynn for his review)....Trustee Pope sd. budget wld. not be finalized before 4/17/89...

RULES OF ORDER:

N.Y. Village Law 4-400(2)
