Matter will be checked further with Attorney Nesbitt.

Present: Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald, and Trustees David McGuire, Robert Brown and Warner Strong. Absent, Trustee Lloyd A. Green.

Vouchers: Motion by Trustee Brown, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, to approve payment of the vouchers as presented in the amount of \$11,973.98.

R. Culver Fire Chief: Richard Culver, Fire Chief, advised that the six fire phones now in use are inadequate to cover a 24 hour period, especially week-ends. He made the request for a ten (10) phone system at a cost of \$77.53 per month plus \$130.00 for installation charge. Trustee Brown made motion to authorize expenditure unless another more practical solution can be found, 2nd by Trustee McGuire. Motion carried. Cost will be \$1,000.00 per year.

Ackart Water Line: Wayne Ackart, Lozier Engineers, advised that the plans and specifications were almost complete on the additions of the water plant. He disclosed that there are bad leaks along the water line near Canandaigua outlet and Hacienda tavern. He suggested that the Village get all leaks repaired along the line as soon as possible. He then showed plans for construction of additions of the water treatment plant. It was then discussed that Lozier's make a survey of easement on tavern property and the cost of the survey would be submitted to the Board at a later date.

Sapienza Annex. Cdga Rd. Prop.: James Sapienza stated that he was interested in annexing his property to the Village if sewers could be supplied to four properties; ie Anson Johnson, James Sapienza, William Parsons, Robert Manning and Hart Pierce. These residents would like a firm committment from the Village that sanitary sewers would be installed. The Board will look into the matter further and report to Mr. Sapienza.

Boland Complaint: Mrs. Boland issued a complaint of a horse being harbored in a small enclosure and not being properly cared for. Board will check into the matter.

Sign Ord.: Motion to approve sign ordinance, 2nd by Brown, as a local law.

Budget Adopt.: Motion was made by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Brown to adopt the budget for the year 6/1/73-5/31/74, with the amount to be raised by taxation in the amount of \$255,941.20 at a rate of \$14.70/M. A voice vote was taken:

**NOTICE OF ADOPTION
OF AMENDMENT TO
VILLAGE ORDINANCE**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the following Amendment to the Village Ordinance entitled "Control of Dogs and Other Animals Ordinance" heretofore adopted by the Board of Trustees on the 6th day of July, 1971, was adopted by the said Board of Trustees on the 26th day of February, 1973:

Section 8. Running at Large, shall be amended to read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any owner of or any person harboring any dog in the Village of Palmyra to permit or allow such dog to run at large unless accompanied by its owner or a responsible person able to control the animal.

Section 12 is hereby repealed.

This amendment shall take effect on June 1, 1973.

Landfill Bids: Trustee Strong suggested that H. Nesbitt write an addendum on a cancellation clause if "Tri-Town Landfill" goes into operation before contract at Village Landfill expires.

Bradish Illness: Trustee Brown discussed illness of Wilferd Bradish, employee in Highway Department, who expects to be out of work for two weeks and Trustee Brown was concerned as to whether Board would be willing to pay employee for one week since Bradish is a steady worker. Motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee McGuire to pay him one week's salary. Motion carried.

Rabbit Show: Mrs. Kiesinger of Walworth asked permission to use the Village Park on June 10, 1973 beginning at about 1:00 P.M. (Sunday) for a Rabbit Show which her 4-H group is sponsoring. Motion made by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Strong to give permission for this group to use the park on that date.

Present: Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald, and Trustees David McGuire, Warner Strong, Lloyd A. Green. Absent, Trustee Robert Brown.

Vouchers: Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green to approve payment of vouchers in the amount of \$3,828.09.

Minutes: The minutes of the regular meeting of 4-23-73 were corrected to read: Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Brown to approve Sign Ordinance to approve sign ordinance as a local law.

Flood Insurance: Trustee Green read a letter from the Wayne Economic Development Corp. disclosing that Palmyra residents can make an application for federally subsidized flood insurance. The insurance, however, restricts future building in the designated flood area and the matter was tabled for the time being until further information could be obtained by the Board.

Boy Scouts Working With Fire Dept.: A motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green to instruct clerk to write letter to H. B. Nesbitt, Village Attorney, inquiring of Village's liability exposure having Boy Scouts working with the Fire Department in care of an accident.

United Way: George Contant came before the Board explaining the payroll deduction plan of the United Way Fund. He asked that the Board consider this way of employee's giving to this fund on a voluntary basis.

Water Leak Cdga.: A letter was received from Wayne Ackart, Lozier Engineers, Inc., stating he had procured copy of a map prepared by John Anderson showing the tavern encroachment on Village's easement. Lozier's suggested that they do a survey to tie in the easement, the pipeline and the Tavern. The price for this survey would be not to exceed \$200.00 and would include a signed map of Lozier's findings. A motion was made to proceed with the survey at a cost not to exceed \$200.00. Motion carried.
Ray Smith is to be given orders to start digging operations on leak near tavern.

May 7, 1973

- Proclamation:** Mayor Fitzgerald read a letter for the N.Y.S. Executive Dept. Office for the Aging asking that Palmyra proclaim the month of May as Senior Citizen month.
- H.B.N. Leak at Canandaigua:** Attorney Nesbitt reiterated the problems of the water leaks near the tavern at Canandaigua and the problems he had discussed with Ray Smith of excavating so close to the tavern and the possibility of inserting a plastic sleeve in the main to correct the problem. This might be advisable since there are other leaks in the line in this area.
- H.B.N. Potter Case:** Mayor Fitzgerald stated that he had talked with Mr. Potter re his sign to no avail and Trustee Strong made a motion, 2nd by Trustee Green to instruct Attorney Nesbitt to proceed with the case.
- R. Butler & Citizens:** Mr. Butler spoke of his concern for all the vandalism in the village. John Blazey read letter re: teenagers roaming streets destroying property and harassing citizens. A long discussion ensued about this topic and complaint of John Blazey Jr.'s car radio aerial being destroyed, his complaints of manner in which Police handled the matter. Board decision to draw up guidelines for Police Dept. with cooperation of public to these guidelines.
- B. Wideman:** Zoning Officer Wideman requested of Board that the curbs and gutter and streets specifications be passed.
- L. Lynch Comm. Ctr.:** Mrs. Lynch stated that the Community Center is desirous of expanding its program to include more activities for girls such as cosmetology. The Community Center Board is looking into the plan for a building at a cost of \$70,000.00 which would be financed through solicitations and Revenue Sharing. Mrs. Lynch made a request for the use of the Vienna St. park for center activities this summer instead of all the activities being located in the park on E. Main St. She posed the question of why didn't the Village pay hospital insurance and retirement for James Campbell, Center Director. She was asked by the Board to submit an annual report from the Community Center Board.
- Urban Renewal:** Mayor Fitzgerald reported of his meeting with the Urban Renewal Board. Trustee Strong made a request of a monthly report of minutes from the Urban Renewal Board meetings and its progress.
- Add Unpd. Wat. & Sew. to Taxes:** The following motion was made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried:
RESOLVED: Whereas unpaid water and sewer bills plus late charges amount to #3,317.08, and,
WHEREAS, in accordance with State Village Law any unpaid charges on property become an assessment on the property,
BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Treasurer add the unpaid charges in the amount of \$3,317.08 to the taxes to be levied as of 6-1-73 on the properties so involved.
- Appt. Fire Dept.:** Motion made by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire to accept William Romeiser of 404 Fayette St. be accepted into the Fire Department. Motion carried.
- Req. St. Dance:** The motorcycle club on Cuyler St. has requested to hold a street dance. The request was denied by the Board.
- Police Report:** Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, to accept the monthly police report.
- United Way:** Motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green to have clerk write Village employees regarding payroll deduction plan for the United Way fund.
- Adjourn:** Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Strong to adjourn meeting at 10:25 P.M. Motion carried.
