Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald, and Trustees Lloyd A. Green, Warner Strong, David McGuire and Mary Lou Wilson.

Mayor Fitzgerald called the meeting to order and asked for a two 2 Min. Silence: minute silence.

Regarding Review Trowbridge Matter: Lt. Wm. Benedict of the Wayne Co. Sheriff's Dept. advised Patrolman Jas. Smith and Sheriff Deputy R. Bennie to not awaken Patrolman Fred Trowbridge so that Police Chief Donald Henry might be the one to verify the patrolman sleeping in the patrol car, when he arrived.

On motion by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee McGuire, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved with the amendments.

Village Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer informed the board by a letter Vil.Att. to Mayor Fitzgerald that she would accept the position of Letter: Village Attorney for the next fiscal year at an annual salary of \$6,000.00 but that this amount did not include any litigation or bond issues.

Trustee Green advised that he is delving into the matter in Hwy.Trk.: view of the correspondence from U.W. Sherburne, low bidder, who informed the board that a truck would not be available from their supplier until the spring of 1975.

Trustee Wilson informed the board that she had recently talked to Citizen Mrs. Ann Moss relative to a planned program in October for new citizens of the United States in our village and town. Program:

Mayor Fitzgerald commented that he would talk further with Bruce Clean. Wideman relative to the cleaning of the debris in the Towpath. Towpath:

E.Fost.& Olgerts Sniedze, Woodward Associates, Webster, N.Y., Consulting Howell Sts. Engineers, advised that the timing is good for bidding the Sew.Line: extension of the sewer line. Bid opening could be early in June, 1974, with a possible construction starting date of the latter part of July.

The test borings, he continued, showed water only four (4) feet underground with very bad digging, hard-pan being beneath the Test Bor. Report: surface.

O. Sneidze advised the board that he had prepared the necessary App. to forms for submission to the State Department of Health for their State: approval. The forms, he continued, should be signed by the mayor, on board approval. Board so agreed.

District Attorney Stephen Sirkin, Public Defender Ronald Valentine, Village of Palmyra Acting Police Justice Charles Richardson were present. Court Discuss: Village Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer had previously submitted a letter to Mayor Fitzgerald relative to the scope of services to be performed by an Acting Police Justice, which was read by Mayor Fitzgerald. In essence, an Acting Police Justice, can handle a case only when the Police Justice is not available. Attorney Poyzer:

If the Village Police Justice is available, in accordance with the opinions in my letter, he should act.

Trustee Strong:

Why can't Town Justice act?

Atty. Poyzer: The Judicial Conference should be the one to rule on such a matter, and would investigate same. District Attorney Sirkin agreed.

Mayor Fitzgerald:

Asked Public Defender Valentine what his opinion on the matter is.

Pub. Def. Valentine:

From the legal standpoint, the elected village justice is the one who should handle the cases unless the matter has gone to a plea or the commencement of a trial. As long as the village justice is available, he should be the one to handle the cases. There have been times when calls have been made at 2:00 A.M. in the morning to Police Justice Rubery's office and naturally he would not be available to answer the phone. In the Village of Newark, of the recent 100 cases handled by

Public Defender Valentine, none have been in front of the Acting Police Justice.

Acting Police Justice should be used only in emergencies.

Sirkin:

Dist. Atty. At times a Town Justice would have to hand back to the Village Justice a case that he may have arraigned.

Trustee Green:

Apologized to the gentlemen for infringing on their time to reiterate the same opinion already submitted by Attorney Poyzer, which clarified the matter.

Plea Bargain .: Mayor Fitzgerald wondered if the papers drawn by the police department are so faulty that many of those apprehended appear to be allowed to go "Scot Free" or with a reduced charge.

Sirkin:

Dist.Atty. Commented that of 25 burglary convictions, 30% were from the Village Sirkin: of Palmyra that have appeared in his court. He wanted to compliment the Palmyra Police Force for their enforcement. He commented that a police officer who makes an arrest needs reasonable cause but not proof beyond reasonable doubt.

Pub. Def. Valentine:

Commented that many cases are dismissed on plea bargaining. Occasionally, problems arise because of government agencies. conduct of the court is not the jurisdiction of a village board. A village does not have the facilities to handle 14 and 15 year olds. This is a matter for family court.

Funeral Home:

D. Sinclair Donald Sinclair, presently manager of the Cady & Mate Funeral Home, advised the board that he is planning to construct a new funeral home as well as a residence for his family and himself which will face on Vienna Street with the back on East Main Street just outside the village limits in the vicinity where Vienna Street meets East Main Street, or Route #31, in a triangular or "flat-iron" shaped area. He commented that originally there was an old farmhouse here which was serviced with water from the Village of Palmyra. He would like to obtain permission from the Village Board to be allowed to connect his new buildings to the Village water supply. The following resolution was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Wilson:

Resol. to grant request:

WHEREAS, Donald Sinclair, funeral director has requested permission to connect to the village water lines outside of the village limits on Vienna Street, which is already serviced with water, but not a district, to supply water to a proposed funeral home

and private residence, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, he be informed that this board shall grant this request provided that he apply to the village clerk for service and with the payment of \$200.00, the usual fee for connection, and the charge for water consumption shall be double

that of the village rate. Trustee McGuire Vote:

R.Peterson, Wayne Co.Plan. Board: Robert Peterson, Chairman of the Wayne County Planning Board, and Supervisor Roy Aplin, Town of Palmyra, discussed with the board the long range plans of the county for water. Chairman Peterson revealed that in the next fifteen to twenty years, it is expected that the county will need 15 to 20 million gallons of water per day to meet consumer needs. The easiest option would be to buy water from the Monroe County Water Authority. The cost would be amortized on the county tax base. A possible 20¢ per \$1,000. assessed valuation could be expected for the Village of Palmyra. The Monroe County Water Authority would sell to Wayne County at the rate of 61¢ but the county rate to the village would be closer to 71¢ to 73C per 1,000 gallons.

The county, he continued, has not acted on the resolution presented to the County Board of Supervisors, relative to this

proposal.

Cost: \$7-\$8 Million: The cost for a system across the county could be estimated at seven to eight million. With the installation of such a line, this would not mean that the village could not continue to use its own line to Canandaigua Lake. The capital cost of the construction of the line would be borne by all the county but user cost would be levied on only the villages or towns who would use the metered water. There are 25 villages and towns in the county, which Chairman Peterson intends to confer with.

Super. Aplin: Town of Palmyra Supervisor Roy Aplin, commented that the resolution drafted and turned down by the Board of Supervisors, indicates that the Monroe County Water Authority would "pin" down the county. A mention was made of Gananda. Monroe County Water Authority has to sell to Gananda, as there is no other place they can get the required amount for the project.

Summary:

Chairman Peterson summarized that in essence the Monroe County Water Authority would be a "back-up" system for the Village of Palmyra should the need arise.

Brd.Super. Allocate Funds: Wayne County planner Robert Peterson was questioned relative to possible allocation of funds from the Wayne Co. Board of Supervisors, such as those appropriated to the Village of Lyons, to revitalize its downtown district, for the Village of Palmyra, in view of a newspaper article on 4/17/74, clipped by clerk, Mr. Peterson said that other villages are applying for funds which are specified to be used for lighting, paving, curbing. Board informed him that they, too, want to receive a share in this. He commented that the downtown business men have paid more in sales tax than in county tax. The county program would help to make a study of the south side of the village's Main Street.

Fire Dept. Resol. to Incorp.:

The following resolution was presented by Trustee Wilson:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Palmyra Fire Department under Section 10-1004 and Section 402 of the Membership Comporation Law shall approve the incorporation of the Palmyra Fire Company. Motion by Trustee Strong to table the matter. Motion died for lack of a second.

The following resolution was made by Trustee Wilson:

Attorney L. J. Poyzer advised that she had received a letter from Attorney Strobridge, who suggested that they discuss the matter of the notices sent by Zoning Officer Wideman to Laurence Potter, and the Laundromat relative to the repairing of the hanging signs, which are illegal.

Fire Dept. On motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, the following names were submitted for trainees in the Palmyra Fire Department on the recommendation of the Board of Fire Commissioners with membership contingent upon the training period prescribed: William R. Quick, 123 Vienna St., and Michael W. Johncox, 198 Canandaigua Rd.

Codes:

Attorney Paul Rubery informed the Village Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer that the renumbering of the codification of the ordinances and local laws by General Code Publishers was a system devised by the code publishers. In order to become legal, he commented, a Local Law must be adopted to legalize the numbering system.

Police Report: Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to accept the Police Report for the month of April. Highlights include 164 complaints investigated, 3 each of public intoxication and criminal trespass, along with 27 apprehended for speeding. Total fines and bail forfeitures collected for motor vehicle and criminal arrests amounted to \$525.00.

Sales Tax Resol.:

Mayor Fitzgerald commented that when he attended the county meeting of the mayors, it was proposed that the funds could be presented in cash but this resolution did not indicate this choice. Clerk asked to contact the treasurer of the county for a clarification.

Senior Citizens Month:

Mayor $^{\rm F}$ itzgerald has hereby declared that the month of May shall be so designated as Seniu or Citizens Month.

Memorial Day Parade:

Letter received from the Palmyra Memorial Post VFW extended an invitation to all board members to be present for the annual Memorial Day Parade on May 27, 1974 at 9:00 A.M. Board members to decide if they can attend and so advise the post.

Fire Dept.: A letter indicated that the Palmyra Fire Company will have a parade on August 24, 1974 at 6:30 P.M. in conjunction with the Palmyra Fair. Board members are invited to be a part of the festivities for this annual event.

Arrow Light: Clerk advised a communication from the NYS Dept. of Transportation indicated that the junction of Routes #31 and #21, that arrow lights as of 4/10/74 will be effective. In addition, a flashing red facing south will be displayed continuously.

Pub.Svc. Comm.:

Peterson, Chairman of the Wayne County Planning Board, relative to the possibility of cleaning up the "Towpath" for a bike trail. He commented that he would get a map from Mr. Peterson. Picnic areas could be provided but that no snowmobiles or motorcycles would be allowed in the area. Funds are appropriated by the Wayne County Board of Supervisors, which would be separate from those for the rehabilitation of the downtown area. Board instructed Wideman to get further information on the matter.

King's Compl.: A letter received from Jacqueline Ruth, a resident of the King's Court Apartments, 335 West Main Street, advised that their north view window looked down on the old Erie Canal bed which is littered with trash, including old stoves, refrigerators, etc. Board agreed that Bruce Wideman, Zoning Officer, might investigate and send a notice to the landlord of the property.

Jaycees Request: Nelson Cook, President of the Jaycees, advised that the group would like to erect an "Informational Bulletin Board" between the sidewalk and curb in the vicinity of the Village Park for posting events in the Village. The bulletin board would be 4' x 8', with lexan flass. Announcements would be changed every two weeks by the Jaycees. It would have a cedar shaped roof with weather-proofing on the back and two to three feet off

Refer to

the ground. Plan.Brd. Mayor Fitzgerald advised that the board would refer the matter to the Planning Board, but thanked the group for their suggestion.

Palmyra Historic Group:

Approximately fourteen (14) members of the Palmyra Historic Society, with President Sheldon Knapp as spokesman, informed the board that they were in favor of an architectural review board. He commented that Pittsford has such a group and Canandaigua is in the process of appointing one.

Council of Arts: Sheldon Knapp further commented that there are funds available, up to \$1,500.00 for the formation of such a group. He would have further information at a later date.

Urban Renewal:

The attached resolution relative to the execution of the Capital Grant Contract in an amount not to exceed \$137,433.00 to assist in carrying out project activities, shall be signed by Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald with the approval of the Village Board. (Previous resolution had same wording with the exception that William Roche was named, while Sidney J. Fitzgerald, Mayor, is so designated in this resolution). Resolution on Page 123.

Approval: The board unanimously voted to approve Mayor Fitzgerald signing the necessary forms.

Plan. Brd. Daniel Pope, Chairman of the Planning Board commented that there is no decision at present relative to the re-zoning of the Urban Renewal Area to R-212. Hopefully, he expects to have a recommendation for the board in June. He commented that rumor indicated that this project should be finished by June, 1975. He believed that this could be extended to a later date.

The Palmyra Urban Renewal Agency has undertaken and is carrying out an urban renewal project in said area, hereinafter called the "project," as authorized by and to effectuate the purposes of the Housing Act of 1949 as amended and supplemented.

Section 4. The undertaking and carrying out of the project is essential to the sound growth and development of the Village and to the welfare of the inhabitants thereof.

the project.

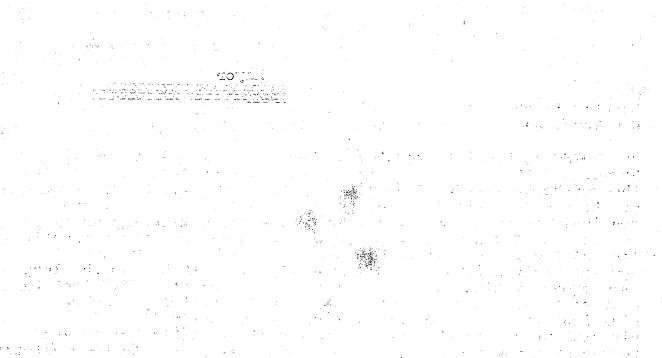
Section 6. The Village of Palmyra hereby expresses its intent and recognizes its responsibility to do whatever is necessary or appropriate
