Present:

Mayor Sidney Fitzgerald and Trustees David McGuire, Warner Strong, Lloyd Green and Robert Brown.

Vouchers:

Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried to approve payment of the vouchers in the amount of \$7,239.60.

Minutes:

An amendment to the previous minutes 5/21/73 as noted by Trustee Strong: William Roche, Urban Relocation Director, advised that the Urban Relocation Director, Donald Sinclair, was no longer on the payroll of the agency as of 3/1/73. Trustee Brown wished to make an amendment in relation to the cost of pipe on Howell Street from the existing water line to extend to the proposed Medical Center of Dr. Smith, to a figure of \$1,500.00 rather than \$1,000.00.
On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, the minutes were approved with amendments.

Neuman Tavern:

Trustee Strong inquired if work had begun to repair the leak adjacent to the Tavern in the Town of Canandaigua at the intersection of East Lake Road and Lake Shore Drive, where the Village of Palmyra water line extends through the property belonging to the Tavern. Trustee Brown commented that Wayne Ackert, Lozier Engineers, felt that other leaks could be repaired first. In addition, Trustee Brown commented, that Ray Smith, our foreman, is reluctant and rightly so, to dig in the area of the tavern without outside help that would be familiar with shoring to excavate deep next to buildings. Trustee Strong indicated that the owners of the Tavern should be notified immediately that we will be excavating to make these water leak repairs. Trustee Brown commented that the Village Attorney would advise them as soon as the work would be scheduled. Trustee Strong emphasized that he felt the village is in error in delaying the matter any longer.

Urban Renewal:

Trustee Strong requested a report from Urban Renewal relative to the costs along with the payrolls of the agency for review by the Village Board. Trustee Strong inquired about a contract with Loziers for the Village in connection with streets, curbing, water and sewer lines.

Urban Renewal:

Providing it is possible to process the necessary formalities, a public hearing regarding Amendments to Zoning Code in relation to Urban Renewal, may be set for July 2, 1973.

Job Incentive:

Mayor Fitzgerald advised that he had attended a meeting in Lyons recently regarding inducing new industry to settle in a village. One suggestion was to allow the industry to have tax relief for approximately ten (10) years. Here again, this might pose a problem should the industry leave and become a "hit and run" outfit.

Canan. Rd. Sew. Line:

Discussion of the sewer line to be extended on Canandaigua Road, when residents annex to the Village of Palmyra. The following motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Brown and carried:

1 Yr. after Annex.:

It has been indicated by James Sapienza, Canandaigua WHEREAS, Road and his adjoining neighbors that they would like to annex to the Village of Palmyra, providing sewerage would be made available,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, If and when these residents annex to the Village of Palmyra, sewerage would be made available one year from the date of annexation.

Mrs. H. Boland:

Mrs. Harold Boland, Laurentian Drive, advised the board that the house south of her in this area apparently does not have proper sanitary connections inasmuch as human excrement appears on the surface of the ground. Board informed her that the matter would be investigated.

4-Way Stop:

George Prindle and Ralph Lavacca, residents near the corner of Prospect Dr. and Fayette St., requested that the corner of Fayette, East Jackson & Prospect Drive be made a "4-Way Stop" intersection.
On motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green, and carried, it was moved to hold a public hearing on 6/18/73.

Landfill:

Attorney H.B. Nesbitt informed the board that Allan Granger had reservations regarding a lease agreement.

Exec. Session: On motion by Trustee Brown, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, the board convened into Executive Session at 7:50 P.M.

Re-Convene:

On motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, the board re-convened to the regular meeting at 8:00 P.M.

Present:

Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald, and Trustees Lloyd Green, Warner Strong, Robert Brown and David McGuire, Attorney Henry B, Nesbitt.

Landfill:

Trustee Green advised that he would contact S. Gilfus to operate the landfill in an emergency situation for \$200.00 per week until such time as new bids might come in.

Stephen Sirkin: Wayne County District Attorney Stephen Sirkin talked with the village board relative to the vandalism problem caused by youthful offenders. Mayor Fitzgerald commented that quite often the police officer charges a young offender with a crime but when it reaches the court, it is then "down-rated". District Attorney Sirkin commented on "plea Bargaining" in the case of 16, 17 and 18 year olds charged with crimes. A general discussion of Criminal Justice, Courts, Probation Department, along with theoritical cases ensued. District Attorney Sirkin mentioned that it is impossible to try all cases, as there are more cases than there is time and staff to process them.

Trustee Strong suggested that many cases should be brought out and reviewed. District Attorney Sirkin commented that the police department may call him any time to read any depositions for any corrections of legal phraseology.

Planning Board:

Chairman Gary O'Dea advised that he would have recommendations from the Planning Board for the next board meeting.

Conflict:

The matter of a conflict between the Palmyra Volunteer Ambulance and the Palmyra Oxygen Squad was mentioned. Trustee Brown read an excerpt from the minutes of the board meeting in November 17, 1970 which cited the Opinion of the Comptroller of the State of New York relative to such a situation. Trustee Brown advised that he would check with both groups to define the ruling for each.

Water Line Tax: Mayor Fitzgerald questioned the taxes that have to be paid on the Village of Palmyra water line which flows from Canandaigua Lake by gravity flow through many townships. Attorney Nesbitt was asked to write the Conference of Mayors, regarding the matter.

Manchester Wat. Contract:

Village of Manchester contracted with the Village of Palmyra approximately 10 years ago, with an amendment to the contract dated in 1964 but revised in January, 1967, with the stipulation that the Village of Manchester might obtain water for a fee of \$3,850.00. However, inasmuch as no water was ever used or needed and none registered on the meter, no bill for the last six (6) had been submitted to Manchester. Attorney Nesbitt read Sections of the contract. The following motion was made by Trustee Strong, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried.

WHEREAS, the Village of Manchester contracted with the Village of Palmyra to obtain water when necessary for an annual fee of \$3,850.00.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the clerk be instructed to send a bill to the Village of Manchester for the amount due from 1/1/67 to

Ronald Smith: 1/1/73.

Advised the board that he had been in several times to obtain specs for bidding on the operation of the landfill. Board advised him that it has been necessary to re-bid the operation of the landfill and such specs would be available in the near future.

Report:

On motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Brown and carried, the Police Report for the month of May, 1973 was approved.
Highlights of the report indicated 204 complaints investigated,
7 Criminal Matters of Burglary 3rd Degree, 7 Speeding and 5
for Illegal Parking. Total fines and bail forfeitures collected
amounted to \$217.00.

Park Lands:

Suggested control of the Park Lands (Village Park, Main St., Prospect Park, bounded by Johnson Street on the east and Fayette on the west, and the Vienna Street Park, adjacent to and north of the Cemetery, property of the Village of Palmyra) was read by Trustee McGuire as follows:

The Control of Village Parks:

Effective June 5, 1973, the following hours governing the Village of Palmyra Park grounds will be instigated:

"Vienna Street Park: Open from 7:00 A.M. & closed at 10:00 P.M., Sunday through Saturday.
"Main Street Park: Open from 7:00 A.M. and closed at

11:00 P.M., Sunday through Saturday.
"Prospect Hill Park: Open from 7:00 A.M. and closed at
10:00 P.M. Sunday through Thursday; Open 7:00 A.M. and closed

12 o'clock midnight Friday and Saturday.

"Any deviation to the above regulations will be subject to approval of the Palmyra Village Board."

On motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Brown and carried, the above rules will be in effect.

Vandalism: A suggested method of control to quell the spread of vandalism was read by Trustee McGuire. It read as follows: was read by Trustee McGuire.

> "For some time the Village of Palmyra and other communities as well, have been plagued with acts of vandalism and petty thievery. Quite naturally, there is much concern on the part of the citizens of the Village of Palmyra who want action by the Police Dept. and the Village Board.

"First of all, let's establish the fact that parents of these vandals should be taking steps to control the activities of their youngsters. The training of these young people must come from the parents and cannot be passed on to the police, school teachers or anyone else.

"It is regrettable that police and officers of the Village must attack the problem from the wrong end of the sequence of events.

"Vandalism is expensive for those people who are the victims of these actions and displays an unbelievable lack of concern for the property of others on the part of the vandals. To combat the problem, the Village Board of Palmyra has decided to take the following actions, starting at once.

- "(1) Police and Auxiliary Police will request the names, ages and address of any young person found to be on the streets after 11:00 P.M. The list will probably show repeated instances which could result in further needed questioning.
- "(2) Special attention will be given to key locations in the village, vulnerable to acts of vandalism.
- "(3) Anyone apprehended as a vandal will be held at the Village Hall by Police, their parents or guardian notified and requested to appear at the Village Hall for release to their custody.
- All cases will be prosecuted and this type of activity will become increasingly more costly for those persons involved.
- Unmarked cars will also be used in the village for additional observation.

"Furthermore, we ask the indulgence of all the people who are not involved in this problem while we establish the identities of those who are and this situation is corrected. We wish and expect any and all acts of vandalism or thievery to be reported immediately for the fastest possible action.

June 4, 1973

Vandalism:

In a greater sense, we as a Village Board, are asking the people of the community to get involved in this problem by speaking up and reporting unlawful acts to the proper authorities."

Motion by Trustee Brown, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried to approve the suggestions of coping with the vandalism problem.

Trustee McGuire, Police Chief Henry and reporter L. Ziegler will confer on the proper newspaper wording.
