H. VanEtten Water & Sewer Operator Hiram VanEtten informed the board that he and Mayor Nussbaumer had viewed the equipment for sale at Bedford, Pa. which might be of use. He felt that the equipment was not worth the price of \$5,000.00 but might be worth \$2,500.00 to the village in that many items would be of no value to our operation. Area involved would be in the angle of Vienna Road and Route #31, southwest corner.

B. Wideman, Zon. Offc. Zoning Officer Wideman informed the board that junk cars and disabled autos were discussed previously with the thought in mind to rewrite the ordinance in relation to yards, parking areas and unregistered vehicles in residential and commercial areas.

Signs:

Zoning Officer Wideman informed the board that he was reviewing the stipulations which relate to signs in the business area.

Letter re:sugg. Zon.Chg.:

A letter from the Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals, Luther G. Sheldon, and endorsed by the other members of the Zoning Board, suggested that the Village Board consider an amendment to the zoning which relates to the issuance of a Special Permit for the remodeling of a single family house to multiple housing. The Zoning Board cited in particular the issuance of a permit for the new construction of a 3 family home at 133 West Jackson Street, all in accordance with the zoning requirements but the general feeling seemed to indicate that the majority of the neighbors were dissatisfied withthe decision as most of these homes had been built at the turn of the century and the type of housing proposed did not seem to blend in with the decor. The same letter was sent to the Planning Board for their perusal.

E. Main Spruce Up: Zoning Officer Wideman advised the board that he had and would continue to contact owners of property in the East Main Street area to ask their cooperation in painting and sprucing up their homes and land area. If this is not successful, he will issue a "Notice & Order."

Press. Sust. Valve: On motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair and carried, Mayor David M. Nussbaumer was directed to sign the agreements for the installation of the Pressure Sustaining Valve at the Filter Plant, in accordance with the awarding of the contract to Clohessey, Inc. in the amount of \$10,355.00.

Health Officer: Dr. William Braell, Charlotte Avenue, informed the Village Board that he did not feel that he would be able to take on the added responsibility as health officer of the Village of Palmyra. Trustee Sinclair volunteered to contact another doctor in the area.

Middle School Sew.Rent: Clerk advised that the business manager, Mr. McGovern for the Palmyra-Macedon School District inquired about the possible sewer fee for the new Middle School. On the basis of the information received of 42 water closets, 23 urinals, 64 sinks, 4 showers, 8 fountains, 1 dishwasher and 2 clothes washers, it might be feasible to base the quarterly fee on 30 units at \$17.28 per unit for a quarterly charge of \$518.40. Motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried to so advise the Palmyra-Macedon School that the sewer rate for the new middle school would be \$518.40 per quarter plus the actual registered amount of water consumed.

Comm. Edison: On motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair and carried, clerk was instructed to purchase 3 1/2 units of Commonwealth Edison stock for \$133.00, which funds to be withdrawn from the P.T. Sexton Checking Account, with stock to become a part of the holdings of the P. T. Sexton Investment.

However, the board informed Mr. VanEtten that when he attends the next meeting of the combined villages and towns whose water supply is Canandaigua Lake, that he should so inform the group that the Village of Palmyra will adopt and comply in any way possible the suggestions and recommendations of the Watershed Board. (Next meeting to be May 24, 1971).

Roch. Telephone:

The Rochester Telephone Company informed the village by letter that they would like to place telephone lines near the water line in the Canandaigua area. They are planning to commence work on April 30, 1971 and would like to have someone advise them where the village water line is located. Clerk was instructed to so alert Raymond Smith to try to arrange his time to cooperate with them.

Dump Stickers: Discussion ensued relative to the issuance of new dump stickers for the Village Fiscal year, 6/1/71 - 5/31/72, and for the Town of Palmyra. On motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Leysath, it was moved that the town and village should have different colors and the fee for the Village of Palmyra shall be \$1.00 for the year but only \$.50 for the town to expire as of 12/31/71, so that a new agreement with the Town of Palmyra may be consumated.

Removal Park. Meters:

Motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried as follows:

RESOLVED: The Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra shall so direct Highway Foreman Raymond Smith to remove the parking meters in the Main Street area and adjoining streets within the next few days.

Water Rates: Trustee Leysath and Trustee Alderman have received water rates from various villages which have been compared with the Village of Palmyra. At this time, it would seem advisable that a study be made to justify the raise in the rates of water within the next year.

Water Cooler:

On motion by Trustee Alderman, 2nd by Trustee Sinclair, the board approved the purchase of a water cooler to be placed in the village barns for the use of the highway crew.

Streets:

Trustee Alderman discussed a survey he had made relative to the resurfacing of the village streets with oil and stone. It was his feeling that if the village does not reseal the streets, they will soon deteriorate and will be a much more costly expense.

Motion by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Leysath that bids be sought for oil and stone.

Curbs:
