#### **VILLAGE OF PALMYRA BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

REGULAR MEETING May 18, 2020 6:30 p.m.

**<u>ROLL CALL</u>**: Present: Mayor Husk, and Trustee Nolan in attendance and Trustees Luke, Perry, and Warters and Attorney Williams by video conferencing as well as members from the public, property owner Jim Moomaw and Caroling Grasso from The *Times of Wayne County*.

## **REGULAR MEETING**

**JIM MOOMAW:** Mr. Moomaw explained that he is losing his downstairs tenant at 315-317 E. Main St. that was actually a residence at one time. The Village Code is just not clear if a first floor apartment is allowed in a C-1 district. He would like to revert it back to living quarters as there is already of glut of storefronts for rent. According to Atty. Williams this is not the duty of the Village Board but more likely can be done simply by a determination of the Code Enforcement Officer or through a variance request to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Mr Moomaw thanked the Board for their time and said he would contact Ron Hall.

## **NEW/OLD BUSINESS:**

**STREET LIGHTING BID:** Mayor Husk reported that only one bid was received on the replacement of the Village-owned streetlights to LED lighting. The bid was from Colacino Industries for \$138,854.00 Motion was made by Trustee Perry, second by Trustee Nolan, to accept the low and only bid for the LED street lighting upgrade for \$138,854.00 and authorize the Mayor to sign any and all contracts with Colacino Industries for the LED street lighting project. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED. Phase I of the projects is the Village-owned streetlights in the business district and will cost about \$67,000 of the total. **FIRE DEPARTMENT:** There are events scheduled for June and beyond at the Fire Hall and Jeanette Eckert questioned if it would be okay to tell the people in charge of the events to go ahead with the event planning. According to NYCOM, non-essential events gatherings are a no-no until at least May 28<sup>th</sup> at which time it will probably be relooked at by the Governor. Even though these are mainly just families that would be getting together, it would still be done in our buildings and around our volunteers. The general consensus of the Board was to follow the guidelines of the state and go from there.

After discussion for a request for a combination Hurst tool from the Fire Department it was decided not to approve this purchase.

**RESOLUTION:** At the April 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Board agreed to move \$8,475 from Water Contingency to F8330.2 Water Fund/Capital Outlay covering the 50% down of the metal roof and the Water Treatment Plant. The project has now been completed and a balance due of \$9745 as 6 inch seamless gutters on the rear center and front center roof also required replacement. Motion was made by Trustee Warters, second by Trustee Perry to transfer the balance of \$9,745 from Water Contingency F1990.4 to F8330.4 Water Fund/Capital outlay to cover the balance due. Vote, ayes. CARRIED.
