APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion was made by Trustee Nolan, second by Trustee Perry, to approve the minutes from May 7, 2018 as submitted. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

APPROVAL OF ABSTRACT: Motion was made by Trustee Perry, second by Trustee Warters to approve payment of Voucher 928 of May 16 for \$25.00 and Abstract #12B vouchers 929-976 for \$38,155.45 including credit from voucher 853 that is now scheduled with voucher 951. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

TRUSTEE REPORTS

Trustee Luke - excused.

Trustee Nolan recapped the WCVOA dinner in North Rose. There were two engineers that spoke about diamond mapping for utilities which is something the Village has already looked into. They concluded by explaining a program that they would like the state to initiate which will be like CHPS, but for infrastructure.

Trustee Perry asked Trustee Nolan to look into the Water issue at the Marina. **Trustee Warters** spoke to the request to the Town about the transfer of our Zoning records.

Attorney Williams reported that the Memo of Understanding has more or less been tidied up. He suggested a resolution to adopt this Memo of Understanding authorizing the Mayor to sign should be done. Motion was made by Trustee Nolan, second by Trustee Warters to approve the Memo of Understanding subject to the confirmation as to the area to be acquired by the Authority from the Village. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

Then he spoke about Fair Market Value and the de-commission of the old sewer plant. It will not be the usual sale of a property for full market value as the benefit of not having ownership in the future needs to be considered as well; another words future benefit plus dollars received shall equal fair market value.

Mayor Husk reported that he has been very busy with many meetings and recapped the meeting with the Supervisor Miller, Marty Aman, and Trustee Perry regarding the proposed shared WWTP. They talked about how the Town is going to acknowledge the new treatment plant which will be the same as everyone else listed in the Memo of Understanding.
