SUBJECT: Victim and Witness Assistance

ISSUE DATE: 03-26-16 **REFERENCE**: 29.4, 29.5

I. PURPOSE

A. To emphasize the needs of victims of criminal and non-criminal incidents and the responsibilities of the members of the Palmyra Police Department to provide support.

B. To provide information and guidance to the victims and witnesses who show a need.

II. POLICY

- A. Officers of the Palmyra Police Department are often in a unique position to provide assistance to the victims of crime and other traumatic incidents. These experiences may have both immediate and/or long-term effects on the individual's emotional recovery.
- B. It is the policy of the Palmyra Police Department to facilitate the ability of victims to secure the assistance and guidance that is necessary for their physical and emotional recovery.
- C. The personnel of the Palmyra Police Department will support and aid victims as they continue to interact with the criminal justice system.

III. PROCEDURE

A. Safety & Security

- Officers are responsible for securing the crime or incident scene to protect lives and ensure the safety of the victims, the public, and officers of the Palmyra Police Department;
- 2. Officers will summon any necessary medical assistance and render any other assistance required:
- 3. After completing their involvement, and whenever possible, officers should not leave a distraught victim alone.
- 4. Arrangements should be made to have a relative, friend or clergyman join the victim for emotional support and comfort.

B. Information & Referral

- 1. It is important that officers take the steps necessary to meet the victims' needs for support and information. These may include:
 - a) Leaving the officer's name, the case number and Department telephone number.
 - b) Encourage the victim to contact the Palmyra Police Department to report additional information about the incident or to request information or assistance
- 2. Provide information on victim service agencies available in the community:

- a) Eligible crime victims shall be provided with the State of New York Crime Victims Board brochure titled "Claim Application and Instructions". This brochure contains a crime victim claim form.
- b) Members of the Department assist the victim understanding the content of the brochure and claim form.
- c) Members of the Department will be required to advise victims of their option to contact the Wayne County District Attorney's Office Victim/Witness Program coordinator or regional Crime Victims Office for assistance or guidance in submitting or completing the Crime Victim's Claim Form.

C. Report of Sex Offenses and Domestic Violence Reports

- 1. When an officer is called to investigate a sex crime, or a domestic violence incident, it is the policy of the Palmyra Police Department to inform the victim(s) of the Victim's Resource Center's services.
- 2. If the victim of a sex crime requests a Rape Crisis counselor's presence, the investigating officer will contact the Victim Resource Center (331-1171) and request a case worker be sent to victim's location.
- 3. As required by Subdivision 2-A of Section 642 of the Executive Law, the Department must provide a "private setting" for interviewing such victims from which the occupants are not visible and their conversation cannot be heard.
- 4. Only those persons directly and immediately related to the interviewing of a particular victim shall be present during questioning. Such persons may include:
 - a) A social worker, Rape Crisis counselor, psychologist, or other professional providing emotional support to the victim unless the victim objects to the presence and requests exclusion of such person.
 - b) Only those police personnel directly involved in the case who need to be present during questioning.
 - c) Where appropriate, the parent or parents of the victim shall be present during the interview if requested by the victim.

5. Victim Assistance:

- a) In every case, the victim, or alleged victim, of a sex crime will be provided in writing with the name, address, and telephone number of the nearest Rape Crisis Center.
- b) In Wayne County, sexual assault counseling services are provided by the Victim Resource Center of the Finger Lakes, Inc.(VRC). The VRC can be contacted via their hotline at (800) 456-1172. The VRC office is located at 132 Harrison Street, Newark.
