<u>RE:CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION</u> – Mr. David Borland, J.R. Hickey Post 120 Commander came before the Board to bring them up to date on the upcoming event slated for August 24 and 25<sup>th</sup> for the James R. Hickey Post 120 Centennial Celebration. The American Legion is celebrating its 100<sup>th</sup> year as well as our local Post. Mayor Husk offered the Legion the Village's support in their efforts for a successful event.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES:</u> Motion was made by Trustee Nolan, second by Trustee Luke to approve the minutes from May 6, 2019 noting that Trustee Luke abstained from the minute approval as she was absent from the April 22 meeting. Vote, 4 ayes, CARRIED.

## TRUSTEE REPORTS

**Trustee Luke** reported briefly about the Terminal wall and Canal Trail grant. They are planning another meeting.

**Trustee Nolan** reported on the WCWSA and engineers to hear an update about the joint WWTP, it is progressing quickly and the work schedule will soon be looked at closely. Another meeting is being planned with finance.

He also shared the monthly operating report for the water and wastewater plants; said report will remain on file in the office of the Clerk Treasurer.

**Trustee Perry** – no report.

Trustee Warters - excused.

Attorney Williams- no report.

**Mayor Husk** reported a packet ready to go to Palmyra Missouri as they requested for a future celebration they will be having. NYSEG will begin work on a gas main replacement on Tremont Street. He shared information about a Canal Corp meeting on 6/4, 11:30 am at Palmyra Town Hall about future plans for the Aqueduct Park Rehabilitation. Some of the auction sales were:

### **NEW/OLD BUSINESS:**

**BUDGET TRANSFER FROM WATER CONTINGENCY F1990.4 TO F1680.4 FOR BADGER SOFTWARE CLOUD UPGRADE** Motion was made by Trustee
Perry, second by Trustee Nolan to authorize a transfer from Water Contingency F1990.4

to F1680.4 Water Data Processing not to exceed \$7295.00 for the new Badger Water Meter Cloud upgrade. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

**YEAR END BUDGET TRANSFERS:** Motion was made by Trustee Perry, second by Trustee Nolan to authorize the Clerk Treasurer to make any necessary year end budget transfers to balance any line item. (The list of transfers will be provided for inclusion in the minutes by the June 17 or July 1 meeting.) Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE AN INCREASED TRANSFER OF
WATER/SEWER FUNDS TO THE RESPECTIVE RESERVES; DISCUSSION
REGARDING A POLICY FOR BALANCES IN WATER AND SEWER — Motion was made by Trustee Nolan, second by Trustee Perry to transfer \$500,00 from water to water reserves (H3), and \$400,000 from sewer to sewer reserves (H4). Vote, 3 ayes.
CARRIED. Further discussion about a reserve policy was tabled.

**NEW ELECTION LAW AND ITS IMPACT:** Clerk Lynch distributed copies of the changes to the Election Law. Employees are allowed upto three hours at their superintendent's discretion (beginning or end of shift) in which to vote without losing pay. Employers must post this law ten days in advance of ANY election and registered employees must notify their supervisor of their intent at least two days before the election.

MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE: To correct an oversight in the budget for 2019-2020, motion by Trustee Perry, second Trustee Nolan to approve bringing Margaret Tracy, the Highway Seasonal position and Eric Schmid upto minimum wage rates in June and Jan 2020, increased costs will be about \$1800. 4 ayes. CARRIED.

**MOTION ADOPTION OF THE TAX LEVY:** Motion was made by Trustee Nolan to adopt the following tax levy:

# **TAX LEVY**

A resolution levying the total taxes and other charges extended and levied against each parcel of real property shown on the rolls prepared and verified by the assessors for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

RESOLVED that there be levied and assessed against the real property of the Village of Palmyra the following sums for Village government and other charges for the fiscal year 2019-2020 a tax rate of \$12.98 per thousand of assessed valuation.
